SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

235 ILCS 5/5-2

Amends the Liquor Control Act of 1934. Provides that the license of a distributor or importing distributor expires January 1 of each year unless sooner revoked or suspended. Effective January 1, 2006.

1 AN ACT concerning liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by changing Section 5-2 as follows:

6 (235 ILCS 5/5-2) (from Ch. 43, par. 117)

7 Sec. 5-2. All licenses, except a distributor's, importing distributor's, non-beverage user's, a special use permit, and a 8 special event retailer's license, issued by 9 Commission, shall be valid from the date of issuance through 10 the last day of the eleventh month that begins after the month 11 12 in which the license is issued unless sooner revoked or suspended as provided in this Act. Beginning January 1, 2006, 13 14 the license of a distributor or importing distributor shall 15 uniformly expire on January 1 of each year unless sooner revoked or suspended as provided in this Act. A non-beverage 16 17 user's license shall expire only when the quantity of alcoholic 18 liquor which may be purchased under it has been exhausted. A 19 special use permit license and a special event retailer's 20 license (not-for-profit) shall be issued for a specific time period, not to exceed 15 days per licensee per location in any 21 12 month period. Licenses shall state thereon the class to 22 which they belong, the names of the licensees and the addresses 23 and description of the premises for which they are granted, or 24 25 the case of caterer retailers, auctions, railroads, 26 airplanes and boats, a designation thereof by number or name; and shall state the dates of their issuance and expiration. 27
