1 AN ACT concerning environmental safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Environmental Protection Act is amended by adding Section 22.50 as follows:
- 6 (415 ILCS 5/22.50 new)
- Sec. 22.50. Computer Equipment Disposal and Recycling
- 8 <u>Commission</u>.

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- 9 <u>(a) The General Assembly finds that improper disposal of</u>
- 10 <u>computer equipment presents a serious environmental threat.</u>
- 11 Computer equipment contains quantities of lead, mercury, other
- 12 <u>heavy metals</u>, and plastics that, when improperly disposed of,
- can lead to environmental contamination.
- 14 <u>(b) There is hereby created the Computer Equipment Disposal</u>
- and Recycling Commission consisting of 7 members appointed as
- follows: 2 members appointed by the Governor, one of whom shall
- serve as Chairperson of the Commission; one member appointed by
- 18 <u>the Lieutenant Governor who shall serve as vice-chairperson;</u>
- one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 20 Representatives; one member appointed by the Minority Leader of
- 21 <u>the House of Representatives; one member appointed by the</u>
- 22 President of the Senate; and one member appointed by the
- 23 Minority Leader of the Senate; all of whom shall serve without
- 24 <u>compensation. The Commission may accept and expend for its</u>
- 25 purposes any funds granted to the Commission by any agency of

9	(d) The Commission shall issue a report of its findings and

12	Assembly, and the Director of the Environmental Protection

14	(e) Beginning on May 31, 2007, the Commission shall
15	evaluate the implementation of programs by the State relating
16	to computer equipment disposal and recycling, and shall issue a
17	report of its finding and recommendations to the Governor, the
18	General Assembly, and the Director of the Environmental
19	Protection Agency on or before December 31, 2008.
20	(f) The Commission, upon issuing the report described in
21	subsection (e) of this Section, is dissolved.
