SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

515 ILCS 5/20-5 520 ILCS 5/3.1-2 from Ch. 56, par. 20-5 from Ch. 61, par. 3.1-2

Amends the Fish and Aquatic Life Code and the Wildlife Code. Allows all veterans (now, only certain disabled veterans) to fish and hunt during times allowed without being required to have a license.

1 AN ACT concerning husbandry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Fish and Aquatic Life Code is amended by changing Section 20-5 as follows:
- 6 (515 ILCS 5/20-5) (from Ch. 56, par. 20-5)
- 7 Sec. 20-5. Necessity of license; exemptions.
- 8 (a) Any person taking or attempting to take any fish, including minnows for commercial purposes, turtles, mussels, 9 crayfish, or frogs by any means whatever in any waters or lands 10 wholly or in part within the jurisdiction of the State, 11 including that part of Lake Michigan under the jurisdiction of 12 this State, shall first obtain a license to do so, and shall do 13 14 so only during the respective periods of the year when it shall 15 be lawful as provided in this Code. Individuals under 16, blind or disabled residents, or individuals fishing at fee fishing 16 17 areas licensed by the Department, however, may fish with sport fishing devices without being required to have a license. For 18 19 the purpose of this Section an individual is blind or disabled 20 if that individual has a Class 2 disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act. For 21 22 purposes of this Section an Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card issued under the Illinois Identification 23 Card Act indicating that the individual named on the card has a 24 25 Class 2 disability shall be adequate documentation of a 26 disability.
 - (b) A courtesy non-resident sport fishing license or stamp may be issued at the discretion of the Director, without fee, to (i) any individual officially employed in the wildlife and fish or conservation department of another state or of the United States who is within the State to assist or consult or cooperate with the Director or (ii) the officials of other

- states, the United States, foreign countries, or officers or representatives of conservation organizations or publications while in the State as guests of the Governor or Director.
 - (c) The Director may issue special fishing permits without cost to groups of hospital patients or handicapped individuals for use on specified dates in connection with supervised fishing for therapy.
 - (d) Veterans who, according to the determination of the Veterans' Administration as certified by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, are at least 10% disabled with service-related disabilities or in receipt of total disability pensions may fish with sport fishing devices during those periods of the year it is lawful to do so without being required to have a license, on the condition that any their respective disabilities do not prevent them from fishing in a manner which is safe to themselves and others.
 - (e) Each year the Director may designate a period, not to exceed 4 days in duration, when sport fishermen may fish waters wholly or in part within the jurisdiction of the State, including that part of Lake Michigan under the jurisdiction of the State, and not be required to obtain the license or stamp required by subsection (a) of this Section, Section 20-10 or subsection (a) of Section 20-55. The term of any such period shall be established by administrative rule. This subsection shall not apply to commercial fishing.
- 26 (f) The Director may issue special fishing permits without 27 cost for a group event, restricted to specific dates and 28 locations if it is determined by the Department that the event 29 is beneficial in promoting sport fishing in Illinois.

- 31 Section 10. The Wildlife Code is amended by changing 32 Section 3.1-2 as follows:
- 33 (520 ILCS 5/3.1-2) (from Ch. 61, par. 3.1-2)
- 34 Sec. 3.1-2. Veterans who, according to the determination of

the Veterans' Administration as certified by the Department of 1 2 Veterans' Affairs, are at least 10% disabled with 3 service-related disabilities or in receipt of total disability 4 pensions may hunt any of the species protected by Section 2.2, during such times, with such devices and by such methods as are 5 permitted by this Act, without procuring hunting licenses, on 6 7 the condition that $\underline{\text{any}}$ their respective disabilities do not prevent them from hunting in a manner which is safe to 8 themselves and others. 9 (Source: P.A. 83-58.) 10
