Makes appropriations for capital expenditures for the following agencies: Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Military Affairs, Department of State Police, Department of Transportation, Capital Development Board, Illinois Commerce Commission, Environmental Protection Agency, Historic Preservation Agency, Illinois Finance Authority, Medical District Commission, Illinois Emergency Management Agency, Eastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University, University of Illinois, Illinois Community College Board, State Board of Education, and State Board of Elections.
