## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the School Code. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning alternative teacher certification.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section 5 21-5c as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/21-5c) 6

Sec. 21-5c. Alternative route to teacher certification. 7 The The State Board of Education, in consultation with the 8 State Teacher Certification Board, shall establish 9 and an alternative route to teacher certification implement 10 program under which persons who meet the requirements of and 11 successfully complete the program established by this Section 12 shall be issued an initial teaching certificate for teaching in 13 14 schools in this State. The State Board of Education shall 15 approve a course of study that persons in the program must successfully complete in order to satisfy one criterion for 16 17 issuance of a certificate under this Section. The Alternative Route to Teacher Certification program course of study must 18 include the current content and skills contained in 19 а 20 university's current courses for State certification which have been approved by the State Board of Education, in 21 22 consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board, as the requirement for State teacher certification. 23

The program established under this Section shall be known 24 25 as the Alternative Route to Teacher Certification program. The 26 program may be offered in conjunction with one or more not-for-profit organizations in the State. The program shall be 27 28 comprised of the following 3 phases: (a) a course of study 29 offered on an intensive basis in education theory, 30 instructional methods, and practice teaching; (b) the person's assignment to a full-time teaching position for one school 31 year, including the designation of a mentor teacher to advise 32

1 and assist the person with that teaching assignment; and (c) a 2 comprehensive assessment of the person's teaching performance 3 officials and program participants by school and а recommendation by the institution of higher education to the 4 5 State Board of Education that the person be issued an initial 6 teaching certificate. Successful completion of the Alternative Route to Teacher Certification program shall be deemed to 7 satisfy any other practice or student teaching and subject 8 9 matter requirements established by law.

10 A provisional alternative teaching certificate, valid for 11 one year of teaching in the common schools and not renewable, 12 shall be issued under this Section 21-5c to persons who at the 13 time of applying for the provisional alternative teaching 14 certificate under this Section:

(1) have graduated from an accredited college or
university with a bachelor's degree;

17 (2) have been employed for a period of at least 5 years
18 in an area requiring application of the individual's
19 education;

20 (3) have successfully completed the first phase of the
21 Alternative Teacher Certification program as provided in
22 this Section; and

(4) have passed the tests of basic skills and subject
 matter knowledge required by Section 21-1a.

An initial teaching certificate, valid for teaching in the common schools, shall be issued under Section 21-3 or 21-5 to persons who first complete the requirements for the provisional alternative teaching certificate and who at the time of applying for an initial teaching certificate have successfully completed the second and third phases of the Alternative Route to Teacher Certification program as provided in this Section.

A person possessing a provisional alternative certificate or an initial teaching certificate earned under this Section shall be treated as a regularly certified teacher for purposes of compensation, benefits, and other terms and conditions of employment afforded teachers in the school who are members of a HB3107 - 3 - LRB094 07165 RAS 37320 b

1 bargaining unit represented by an exclusive bargaining 2 representative, if any.

3 The State Board of Education may adopt rules and 4 regulations that are consistent with this Section and that the 5 State Board deems necessary to establish and implement the 6 program.
