## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

55 ILCS 5/5-1127

Amends the Counties Code. Authorizes a county board to impose a reasonable user fee against any party directly or proximately responsible for the need for the use of emergency response services provided by a technical rescue team. Requires all technical response team user fees collected by the county to be deposited into a fund dedicated to the operation of technical rescue teams. Makes other changes.

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AN ACT concerning local government.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

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Section 5. The Counties Code is amended by changing Section 5 5-1127 as follows:

- (55 ILCS 5/5-1127) 6
  - Sec. 5-1127. HazMat and technical rescue teams.

8 (a) The county board of any county may, by ordinance, authorize a HazMat team to provide emergency response to 9 chemical and biological terrorism, radiological emergencies, 10 hazardous material spills, releases, or fires, or other 11 contamination events. The county board may make reasonable 12 appropriations from the county treasury to fund and encourage 13 14 the formation and operation of a <u>HazMat</u> Hazmat team. The 15 ordinance may provide for benefits to be paid by the county if a team member suffers disease, injury, or death in the line of 16 17 duty. A HazMat team authorized under this subsection may be a 18 not-for-profit organization exempt from federal income taxes 19 under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

(b) The county board of any county may, by ordinance, 20 authorize a technical rescue team to provide emergency response 21 22 to building collapse, high angle rescue, and other technical 23 and specialized rescue emergencies. The county board may make reasonable appropriations from the county treasury to fund and 24 25 encourage the formation and operation of a technical rescue 26 team. The ordinance may provide for benefits to be paid by the county if a team member suffers disease, injury, or death in 27 28 the line of duty. A technical rescue team authorized under this 29 subsection may be a not-for-profit organization exempt from 30 federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. 31

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(c) A county board may impose a reasonable user fee against

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1	any party directly or proximately responsible for the need for
2	emergency response services provided by a technical rescue
3	team. All user fees collected by the county under this
4	subsection (c) must be deposited into a fund dedicated to the
5	operation of technical rescue teams.
