Amends the Criminal Code of 1961. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning obstructing justice.

1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by changing

  Section 31-4 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/31-4) (from Ch. 38, par. 31-4)
- 7 Sec. 31-4. Obstructing justice.
- A person obstructs justice when, with intent to prevent the

  the apprehension or obstruct the prosecution or defense of any

  person, he knowingly commits any of the following acts:
- 11 (a) Destroys, alters, conceals or disguises physical 12 evidence, plants false evidence, furnishes false information; 13 or
- 14 (b) Induces a witness having knowledge material to the 15 subject at issue to leave the State or conceal himself; or
- 16 (c) Possessing knowledge material to the subject at issue,
  17 he leaves the State or conceals himself.
- 18 (d) Sentence.
- 19 (1) Obstructing justice is a Class 4 felony, except as 20 provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection (d).
- (2) Obstructing justice in furtherance of streetgang related or gang-related activity, as defined in Section 10 of the Illinois Streetgang Terrorism Omnibus Prevention Act, is a Class 3 felony.
