Amends the Sex Offender Registration Act. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning penalties.

1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Sex Offender Registration Act is amended by changing Section 10 as follows:

6 (730 ILCS 150/10) (from Ch. 38, par. 230)

7 Sec. 10. Penalty. Any person who is required to register under this Article who violates any of $\underline{\text{the}}$ the provisions of 8 this Article and any person who is required to register under 9 10 this Article who seeks to change his or her name under Article 21 of the Code of Civil Procedure is guilty of a Class 3 11 felony. Any person who is convicted for a violation of this Act 12 for a second or subsequent time is guilty of a Class 2 felony. 13 14 Any person who is required to register under this Article who 15 knowingly or wilfully gives material information required by this Article that is false is guilty of a Class 3 felony. Any 16 17 person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Article shall, in addition to any other penalty required by 18 19 law, be required to serve a minimum period of 20 confinement in the local county jail. The court shall impose a mandatory minimum fine of \$500 for failure to comply with any 21 provision of this Article. These fines shall be deposited in 22 the Sex Offender Registration Fund. Any sex offender, as 23 defined in Section 2 of this Act, or sexual predator who 24 25 violates any provision of this Article may be arrested and 26 tried in any Illinois county where the sex offender can be located. The local police department or sheriff's office is not 27 28 required to determine whether the person is living within its 29 jurisdiction.
