- 8 (a) A person commits burglary when without authority he
- 9 knowingly enters or without authority remains within a

- 11 defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code, railroad car, or any part
- 12 thereof, with intent to commit therein a felony or theft. This
- offense shall not include the offenses set out in Section 4-102
- of the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 15 (b) Sentence.
- Burglary is a Class 2 felony. A burglary committed in a
- 17 school or place of worship is a Class 1 felony. A burglary
- 18 committed in a facility that stores the necessities of life
- 19 such as food, clothing, or other tangibles for free
- 20 distribution to economically disadvantaged persons is a Class 1
- 21 <u>felony</u>.
