

94TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2005 and 2006 HB5522

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/11-213 new

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a peace officer who stops a vehicle for a violation or suspected violation of any law or ordinance, if he or she determines that an occupant of the vehicle is a sexual predator, shall verify that the address provided to the officer by that person is the same address the person provided to local law enforcement in accordance with the Sex Offender Registration Act. Provides that a peace officer who has been provided an incorrect address has probable cause to arrest the person for violation of the Sex Offender Registration Act, unless the person shows that he or she has changed his or her address within the 10 days allowed by that Act.

1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by adding Section 11-213 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/11-213 new)
- Sec. 11-213. Traffic stops; sexual predators.
- (a) A peace officer who stops a vehicle for a violation or 8 suspected violation of this Code or any other State law or 9 local ordinance, if he or she determines that an occupant of 10 the vehicle is a sexual predator as defined in subsection (E) 11 of Section 2 of the Sex Offender Registration Act, shall verify 12 that the address provided to the officer by that person is the 13 same address the person provided to the local chief of police 14 or sheriff in accordance with Section 3 of the Sex Offender 15
- 16 Registration Act.
- 17 <u>(b) A peace officer who has been provided an incorrect</u>
 18 address under subsection (a) of this Section has probable cause
 19 to arrest the person for violation of the Sex Offender
 20 Registration Act, unless the person shows that he or she has
 21 changed his or her address within the previous 10 days, as
- 22 provided in Section 6 of that Act.
