1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 105. The sum of \$300,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Student Assistance Commission for a grant to the Board of Trustees of Chicago State University for the Financial Assistance Outreach Center.
- Section 999. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2006.
