SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations for capital expenditures for the following agencies: Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Military Affairs, Department of State Police, Department of Transportation, Capital Development Board, Illinois Commerce Commission, Environmental Protection Agency, Historic Preservation Agency, Illinois Finance Authority, Medical District Commission, Eastern Illinois University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University, University of Illinois, Illinois Community College Board, State Board of Elections, Architect of the Capitol, and Department of Central Management Services.

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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

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ARTICLE 1

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Section 5. ARTICLE 2

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof 23 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port 24 Development Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce 25 and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with 26 the Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 27 ILCS 750/9-11. 1 Section 10. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof 2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois 3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic 4 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for 5 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

16 Section 25. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build 18 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic 19 Opportunity for grant associated with the Illinois Renewable 20 Fuels Development Act.

21 Section 30. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much 22 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build 23 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic 24 Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of 25 brownfield sites.

Section 35. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Institute of

Section 20. The amounts of \$22,000,000 and \$551,947, or 13 14 so much thereof as may be necessary and remain unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2006, from reappropriations 15 heretofore made in Article 98, Section 20 of Public Act 94-16 0015, are reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to 17 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the 18 purpose of providing partial funds for planning, design, 19 engineering and testing, and construction of a low emissions 20 boiler system for Illinois high-sulfur coals. 21

The sum of \$6,900,000, or so much thereof as 24 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 25 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore 26 made in Article 98, Section 70 of Public Act 94-0015, is 27 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 28 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to 29 companies to expand or construct ethanol plants in Illinois.

30 Section 75. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof

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1 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore 2 made in Article 98, Section 75 of Public Act 94-0015, 3 is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 4 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant 5 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope 6 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. 7 This appropriated amount shall be in addition to any 8 other appropriated amounts which can be expended for 9 these 10 purposes.

Section 80. The sum of \$3,188,434, or so much thereof as 11 12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore 13 made in Article 98, Section 80 of Public Act 94-0015, is 14 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the 15 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant 16 17 Argonne National Laboratory for the Nanotechnology to Institute for bondable infrastructure improvements. 18 This 19 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other appropriated amounts which can be expended for these 20 21 purposes.

Section 90. The sum of \$301,713,361, or so much thereof 22 23 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 24 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore 25 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 5 of Public Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund 26 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for 27 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments 28 29 for planning, engineering, acquisition, construction, 30 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized 31 32 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act

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1 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof 2 Section 95. as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 3 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore 4 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 10 of Public 5 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond 6 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity 7 for the purpose of fostering economic development 8 and increased employment and the well being of the citizens of 9 10 Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for 11 12 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

Section 100. The sum of \$65,712,514, or so much thereof 13 14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore 15 16 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 20 of Public Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond 17 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity 18 improvement for the development and of educational, 19 scientific, technical and vocational programs and facilities 20 and the expansion of health and human services, and for any 21 other purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of 22 the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies 23 24 for such purposes.

25 Section 105. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof 26 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 27 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore 28 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 50 of Public 29 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Capital Development 30 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity 31 for open spaces, recreational and conservation purposes and

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the protection of land and for deposits into the Conservation 2 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State 4 agencies for such purposes.

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Section 110. The sum of \$46,829,075, or so much thereof 5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 6 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore 7 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 75 of Public 8 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Capital Development 9 10 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity local governments for the 11 for grants to acquisition, 12 financing, architectural planning, development, alteration, construction of 13 installation, and capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and 14 land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the 15 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies 16 17 for such purposes.

Section 115. The sum of \$49,847,063, or so much thereof 18 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 19 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore 20 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 90 of Public 21 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' 22 23 Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity 24 for grants to units of government, educational facilities and 25 not-for-profit organizations for education and training, infrastructure improvements and 26 other capital projects including limited 27 but not to planning, construction, reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all 28 29 costs associated with economic development programs, community service programs, public health programs, public 30 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for 31 32 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating

ARTICLE 4

DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

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GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the administration and payment of grants to local governmental units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of boat access areas.

Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act 19 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes 20 21 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the 22 administration and payment of grants to local governmental units for the construction, land acquisition, 23 lease, maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access 24 25 areas.

26 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including 27 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of 28 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 29 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the

1 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for construction and development of facilities for transient, 2 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such 3 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure 4 Grant Program. 5

Section 25. The following named 6 sums, new 7 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named, 8 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources: 9 10 Payable from State Boating Act Fund: For multiple use facilities and 11 12 programs for boating purposes provided by the Department of Natural 13 Resources, including construction 14 15 and development, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land acquisition, 16 17 services, studies and all other expenses required to comply with the 18 19 intent of this appropriation1,200,000 Payable from State Parks Fund: 20 For multiple use facilities and programs 21 for park and trail purposes provided by 22 the Department of Natural Resources, including 23 construction and development, all costs 2.4 25 for supplies, materials, labor, land 26 acquisition, services, studies, and all other expenses required to comply with 27 28

29 Section 30. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as 30 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish 31 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition 32 and development, including grants, for the implementation of 1 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the 2 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically 3 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

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Section 35. To the extent federal funds 4 including 5 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, 6 is 7 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for construction 8 and renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational 9 10 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under the Clean Vessel Act. 11

Section 40. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for wildlife conservation and restoration plans and programs from federal and/or state funds provided for such purposes.

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Section 45. The following named sums, or so much thereof 18 be necessary, respectively, herein made either 19 as may independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government 20 agency thereof, any municipal corporation, 21 or any or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or 22 private corporation, organization, or individual, 23 are 24 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for 25 refunds and the purposes stated:

26 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

30 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and 31 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources, 32 Office of Mines and Minerals for the Landowner Grant Program

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Section 55. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as 4 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of 5 6 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning 7 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned 8 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency 9 10 response.

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The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as 12 Section 60. 13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the 14 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the 15 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now 16 or hereafter amended. 17

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Section 65. The following named sums, 19 new 20 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named, 21 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources: 22 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund: 23 For the acquisition, preservation and 24 stewardship of natural areas, including habitats 25 26 for endangered and threatened species, high 27 quality natural communities, wetlands and other areas with unique or unusual 28 29 30 31 Section 70. The sum of \$22,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space 32 Lands Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of 33

Natural Resources for expenses connected with and to make

1 grants to local governments and to distressed communities as 2 provided in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development 3 Act".

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5 Section 75. The sum of \$550,000, or so much thereof as 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant 7 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the 8 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions 9 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter 10 amended.

FOR ILLINOIS HABITAT FUND PROGRAM

Section 80. The sum of \$1,150,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment Act", as now or hereafter amended.

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Section 85. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as 21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat 22 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for 23 the preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and 24 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor 25 26 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of 27 Sportsmen Series license plates.

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29 Section 90. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as 30 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of 31 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water 32 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for 33 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress 34 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in

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Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated),
 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15
 ILCS 515/1 Illinois Compiled Statutes.

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Section 95. The following named sums, or so much thereof 5 6 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either 7 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government agency thereof, any municipal corporation, 8 or any or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or 9 private corporation, organization, or individual, 10 are 11 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for refunds and the purposes stated: 12

13 Payable from Land and Water Recreation Fund:

14 For Outdoor Recreation Programs\$6,200,000

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Section 100. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as 16 is appropriated from the Off Highway 17 may be necessary, 18 Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit 19 20 organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as 21 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act, 22 23 including administration, enforcement, planning and implementation of this Act. 24

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26 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much 27 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government 28 agency thereof, any municipal corporation, 29 any or or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or 30 31 private corporation, organization, or individual, are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for 32 refunds and the purposes stated: 33

34 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire

1 Protection Assistance Fund:

5 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail 7 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for 8 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit 9 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction, 10 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and 11 areas for the use of snowmobiles.

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13 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as 14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry 15 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for 16 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of 17 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the 18 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter 19 amended.

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21 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including 22 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum 23 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry 24 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for 25 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.

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Section 130. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as 27 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory 28 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources 29 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North 30 31 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically provides 32 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the 33 34 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

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Section 135. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory 3 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources 4 for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl 5 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United 6 7 specifically provide waterfowl States which for the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as 8 amended. 9

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Section 140. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

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Section 145. The sum of \$2,500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants to units of local government for the acquisition and development of bike paths.

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Section 150.
