## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

10 ILCS 5/7-43	from Ch.	46,	par.	7-43
10 ILCS 5/7-44	from Ch.	46,	par.	7-44

Amends the Election Code. Provides that a voter casting ballots in a primary election shall receive the ballots of all political parties, but may vote in the primary of only one political party (except that a voter may vote both statewide and local party ballots with respect to mutually exclusive portions of the ballots).

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing
Sections 7-43 and 7-44 as follows:

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6 (10 ILCS 5/7-43) (from Ch. 46, par. 7-43)
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Sec. 7-43. <u>Primary voter qualifications.</u> Every person having resided in this State 6 months and in the precinct 30 days next preceding any primary therein who shall be a citizen of the United States of the age of 18 or more years, shall be entitled to vote at such primary.

12 The following regulations shall be applicable to 13 primaries:

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No person shall be entitled to vote at a primary:

(a) <u>(Blank)</u>. Unless he declares his party affiliations as
 required by this Article.

17 (b) <u>(Blank).</u> Who shall have signed the petition for 18 nomination of a candidate of any party with which he does not 19 affiliate, when such candidate is to be voted for at the 20 primary.

21 (c) <u>No person shall be entitled to vote at a primary</u> who 22 shall have signed the nominating papers of an independent 23 candidate for any office for which office candidates for 24 nomination are to be voted for at such primary.

(c.5) <u>(Blank).</u> If that person has participated in the town political party caucus, under Section 45 50 of the Township Code, of another political party by signing an affidavit of voters attending the caucus within 45 days before the first day of the calendar month in which the primary is held.

30 (d) <u>(Blank).</u> If he has voted at a primary held under this

primary is held: Provided, participation by a primary elector 1 2 in a primary of a political party which, under the provisions of Section 7-2 of this Article, is a political party within a 3 city, village or incorporated town or town only and entitled 4 5 hereunder to make nominations of candidates for city, village 6 incorporated town or town offices only, and for office or offices, shall not disqualify such primary elector 7 from participating in other primaries of his party: And, 8 provided, that no qualified voter shall be precluded from 9 10 participating in the primary of any purely city, village or incorporated town or town political party under the provisions 11 of Section 7-2 of this Article by reason of such voter having 12 voted at the primary of another political party within a period 13 of 23 calendar months next preceding the calendar month in 14 which he seeks to participate is held. 15

16 (e) In cities, villages and incorporated towns having a board of election commissioners only voters registered as 17 provided by Article 6 of this Act shall be entitled to vote at 18 19 such primary.

(f) No person shall be entitled to vote at a primary unless 20 he is registered under the provisions of Articles 4, 5 or 6 of 21 this Act, when his registration is required by any of said 22 23 Articles to entitle him to vote at the election with reference to which the primary is held. 24

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Sec. 7-44. Initialing of ballots; local parties.

(a) Any person desiring to vote at a primary shall state 28 29 his or her name and, residence and party affiliation to the primary judges, one of whom shall thereupon announce the same 30 31 in a distinct tone of voice, sufficiently loud to be heard by all persons in the polling place. When article 4, 5 or 6 is 32 applicable the Certificate of Registered Voter therein 33 prescribed shall be made and signed and the official poll 34 record shall be made. If the person desiring to vote is not 35

challenged, one of the primary judges shall give to him <u>or her</u> one<del>, and only one,</del> primary ballot <u>of each</u> of the <u>established</u> political <u>parties nominating candidates for office at the</u> <u>primary election</u>, but the voter may cast a ballot of only one

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4 5 political party, except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) 6 party with which he declares himself affiliated, on the back of 7 which the such primary judge shall endorse his or her initials in such manner that they may be seen when the primary ballot is 8 properly folded. If the person desiring to vote is challenged 9 10 he or she shall not receive a primary ballot from the primary 11 judges until he or she shall have established his or her right 12 to vote as hereinafter provided in this Article. No person who to state his party affiliation shall be allowed to vote 13 refuses 14 at a primary.

(b) A person who <u>casts a ballot of</u> <del>declares his party</del> 15 16 affiliation with a statewide established political party and 17 requests a primary ballot of such party may nonetheless <u>also</u> declare his affiliation with a political party established only 18 19 within a political subdivision, and may also vote in the 20 primary of <u>a</u> such local <u>political</u> party <u>established</u> only within a political subdivision on the same election day, provided that 21 the such voter may not vote in both such party primaries with 22 23 respect to offices of the same political subdivision. However, no person casting a ballot of declaring his affiliation with a 24 25 statewide established political party may vote in the primary 26 of any other statewide political party on the same election 27 day. A space shall be provided on the primary ballot indicating for which political party the voter cast his or her votes and 28 the voter may mark the space on the ballot of only one 29 political party indicating that party, except as otherwise 30 31 provided in this Section. If the voter desires to cast his or her ballot of a Statewide political party and a political party 32 established only within a political subdivision, the voter may 33 indicate that choice by marking the space provided on the 34 ballot of the Statewide political party and by also marking the 35 space provided on the ballot of the political party established 36

1	only within a political subdivision. If the voter does not mark
2	the space on the primary ballot indicating the political party
3	in which the voter cast his or her ballot, the judges of
4	election shall count only the votes of the political party in
5	which the voter cast a vote for the office nearest the top of
6	the ballot.
