WHEREAS, Reverend Copeland was born in Winn Parish, Louisiana, to Georgia Ann and William H. Copeland, Sr.; he completed high school in Louisiana and then earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Missouri Western University in St. Joseph, Missouri; he also attended National College in Kansas City, Missouri, and the University of Missouri at Kansas City; he received theological training from Western Baptist Bible College, Kansas City National College, and William Jewel College; he holds an Honorary Doctorate of Divinity degree from Morris College and McKinley Theological Seminary; and

WHEREAS, He was called to pastor Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church in 1971, and since then he has consistently shown his concern for the souls and spiritual well-being of mankind and for the social conditions that people face daily; he has been a leader in the fight against racism and injustice and has battled for the right of every child to have equal access to a quality education; he has organized marches against gangs and violence and helped to create the Martin Luther King Jr. Foundation; and

WHEREAS, Under his leadership, the church erected a half-million dollar edifice in 1976 with the mortgage being fully satisfied in 1986; the church purchased and renovated what now serves as the Morning Star Community Center; additionally, the ministries of Morning Star have grown tremendously, and the church is currently recognized as a influential social and political icon positive, in the Kankakeeland community; and

1 WHEREAS, He is active in many civic and community 2 organizations and has served as president of the NAACP and the 3 Northeastside Ministerial Alliance; he has also served as 4 coordinator of the Kankakee County chapter of the Rainbow PUSH 5 Coalition and was one of six pastors to receive the Founder's 6 Award from PUSH, one of the organizations highest awards; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Copeland has been the recipient of numerous awards, including the Ebony Esteem Award for "Man of the Year" and "Most Outstanding Man in Religion" for Kankakee County; he was named "Minister of the Year" by the Midwestern Illinois Laymen's Fellowship and has received many other recognitions, and on February 26, 2006, he received "The African American Heritage Honoree Award" from the Victory Christian International Ministries; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Copeland is married to the former Leola Coley; they are the parents of Reverend Kenneth Edward Copeland (Starla) and Monica Rochelle (Reverend John W. Fountain) and the grandparents of William Jibri, Imani Monique, Abeni Jamilah, Titus Omari, and Malik Jamal; therefore, be it
