HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Kirk Rueter of Hoyleton has announced his 3 retirement from major league baseball, ending a 13-year major 4 league career; and

5 WHEREAS, During his career, he became the winningest 6 left-handed pitcher in San Francisco Giants history; he came to 7 the Giants from the Montreal Expos in a 1996 trade; he had 8 joined the Expos in 1993, beginning his major league career 9 with an impressive 8-0 mark that was the best to start a career 10 since 1904; and

WHEREAS, Over 13 seasons with the Expos and Giants he went 130-92 with a 4.27 ERA and became the first Giants lefty since Carl Hubbell to win at least ten games in seven consecutive seasons; he had a 13-6 record with a 3.45 ERA for the NL West champion Giants in 1997; he finished a career-best 16-9 in 1998; and he went 13-8 with a 3.23 ERA for the 2002 pennant winners, including a victory over St. Louis in the National League Championship Series; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rueter, known in the clubhouse as "Woody", finished his career with no major injuries and 38 games over .500; he had pinpoint control over the ball and a fearlessness that impressed teammates and opponents; the Giants will host a day in his honor at a game this season; and

WHEREAS, He played American Legion baseball for George M. Nelms Post 446 of Centralia and helped the team reach the State tournament in 1988 after being Most Valuable Player of the Fifth Division Tourney; he pitched for Murray State University and was drafted after his junior year in the 18th round, following a season with a record of 11-2; and

WHEREAS, He is a 1988 graduate of Nashville Community High

- 1 School in Nashville, Illinois; during his retirement, he plans
- 2 to focus on his wife, Karla, and his daughters, Hope and Halle;
