Americans who hunted, fished, and farmed much of the land from
Florida to Illinois prior to the influx of the Muskhogean,
Iroquoian, and Algonkian Peoples and now primarily live in the
northeastern part of Oklahoma; and

HOUSE RESOLUTION

- 7 WHEREAS, Tsoyaha, their own name for themselves, means
 8 "Children of the Sun", and the tribe, also called Yuchi, are,
 9 along with Muskogee Creeks, the early ancestors of the Seminole
 10 Tribes; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Yuchi once resided within southeastern 12 Illinois in the vicinity of the Skillett Fork, Embarras, and 13 Little Wabash Rivers and are directly involved in the Mound 14 Building culture, which flourished throughout Illinois and 15 neighboring states; and
- WHEREAS, The Yuchi population plummeted in the 18th century due to foreign diseases and war with the Cherokee, and it is currently estimated that there are approximately 3,000 Yuchi people left; therefore, be it
- 20 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
 21 NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
 22 we recognize and commend the people of the Yuchi; and be it
 23 further
- 24 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be 25 presented to the People of the Yuchi Tribe as an expression of 26 our esteem.
