WHEREAS, She was united in marriage to Thomas O. Brownlee Sr. on September 6, 1958, in Chicago; they shared 47 wonderful years of marriage; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Brownlee joined the Independence Blvd Seventh-Day Adventist Church in Chicago in 1961, where she remained a very active member until her death; she served as a Board member, a Home and School Leader, Ingathering Coordinator, Sabbath School Superintendent, Community Service Assistant Director, Investment Leader, and a member of the Society of Christian Ladies; she was proud and honored to have coordinated the church's current educational fundraising project; and
