AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 3. The Department of Natural Resources
(Conservation) Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois
is amended by changing Section 805-420 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 805/805-420) (was 20 ILCS 805/63a36)

8 Sec. 805-420. Appropriations from Park and Conservation 9 Fund. The Department has the power to expend monies 10 appropriated to the Department from the Park and Conservation 11 Fund in the State treasury for conservation and park purposes.

All revenue derived from fees paid for certificates of 12 duplicate certificates of title 13 title, and corrected 14 certificates of title and deposited in the Park and 15 Conservation Fund, as provided for in Section 2-119 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, 16 shall be expended solely by the 17 Department pursuant to an appropriation for acquisition, 18 development, and maintenance of <u>recreational</u> bike paths or 19 trails that are open only to pedestrians, equestrians, and non-motorized vehicles, including grants for the acquisition 20 and development of recreational bike paths or trails that are 21 open only to pedestrians, equestrians, and non-motorized 22 23 vehicles.

- 25 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing 26 Section 2-119 as follows:

28 Sec. 2-119. Disposition of fees and taxes.

(a) All moneys received from Salvage Certificates shall bedeposited in the Common School Fund in the State Treasury.

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(b) Beginning January 1, 1990 and concluding December 31, 1 2 1994, of the money collected for each certificate of title, duplicate certificate of title and corrected certificate of 3 title, \$0.50 shall be deposited into the Used Tire Management 4 5 Fund. Beginning January 1, 1990 and concluding December 31, 1994, of the money collected for each certificate of title, 6 duplicate certificate of title and corrected certificate of 7 8 title, \$1.50 shall be deposited in the Park and Conservation 9 Fund.

Beginning January 1, 1995, of the money collected for each 10 11 certificate of title, duplicate certificate of title and 12 corrected certificate of title, \$2 shall be deposited in the Park and Conservation Fund. The moneys deposited in the Park 13 and Conservation Fund pursuant to this Section shall be used 14 for the acquisition and development of <u>recreational</u> bike paths 15 16 or trails that are open only to pedestrians, equestrians, and 17 non-motorized vehicles, as provided for in Section 805-420 of the Department of Natural Resources (Conservation) Law (20 ILCS 18 19 805/805-420).

Beginning January 1, 2000 and continuing through December 20 31, 2004, of the moneys collected for each certificate of 21 title, duplicate certificate of title, and corrected 22 23 certificate of title, \$48 shall be deposited into the Road Fund and \$4 shall be deposited into the Motor Vehicle License Plate 24 Fund, except that if the balance in the Motor Vehicle License 25 26 Plate Fund exceeds \$40,000,000 on the last day of a calendar 27 month, then during the next calendar month the \$4 shall instead 28 be deposited into the Road Fund.

Beginning January 1, 2005, of the moneys collected for each certificate of title, duplicate certificate of title, and corrected certificate of title, \$52 shall be deposited into the Road Fund.

Except as otherwise provided in this Code, all remaining moneys collected for certificates of title, and all moneys collected for filing of security interests, shall be placed in the General Revenue Fund in the State Treasury. SB0059 Engrossed

(c) All moneys collected for that portion of a driver's
 license fee designated for driver education under Section 6-118
 shall be placed in the Driver Education Fund in the State
 Treasury.

5 (d) Beginning January 1, 1999, of the monies collected as a 6 registration fee for each motorcycle, motor driven cycle and 7 motorized pedalcycle, 27% of each annual registration fee for 8 such vehicle and 27% of each semiannual registration fee for 9 such vehicle is deposited in the Cycle Rider Safety Training 10 Fund.

11 (e) Of the monies received by the Secretary of State as 12 registration fees or taxes or as payment of any other fee, as 13 provided in this Act, except fees received by the Secretary 14 under paragraph (7) of subsection (b) of Section 5-101 and 15 Section 5-109 of this Code, 37% shall be deposited into the 16 State Construction Fund.

17 (f) Of the total money collected for a CDL instruction permit or original or renewal issuance of a commercial driver's 18 19 license (CDL) pursuant to the Uniform Commercial Driver's License Act (UCDLA): (i) \$6 of the total fee for an original or 20 renewal CDL, and \$6 of the total CDL instruction permit fee 21 22 when such permit is issued to any person holding a valid 23 Illinois driver's license, shall be paid into the 24 CDLIS/AAMVAnet Trust Fund (Commercial Driver's License Information System/American Association of Motor Vehicle 25 26 Administrators network Trust Fund) and shall be used for the 27 purposes provided in Section 6z-23 of the State Finance Act and 28 (ii) \$20 of the total fee for an original or renewal CDL or 29 commercial driver instruction permit shall be paid into the 30 Motor Carrier Safety Inspection Fund, which is hereby created 31 as a special fund in the State Treasury, to be used by the Department of State Police, subject to appropriation, to hire 32 additional officers to conduct motor carrier 33 safety inspections pursuant to Chapter 18b of this Code. 34

35 (g) All remaining moneys received by the Secretary of State36 as registration fees or taxes or as payment of any other fee,

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as provided in this Act, except fees received by the Secretary under paragraph (7) of subsection (b) of Section 5-101 and Section 5-109 of this Code, shall be deposited in the Road Fund in the State Treasury. Moneys in the Road Fund shall be used for the purposes provided in Section 8.3 of the State Finance Act.

(k) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund 10 11 to be known as the Secretary of State Special License Plate 12 Fund. Money deposited into the Fund shall, subject to appropriation, be used by the Office of the Secretary of State 13 (i) to help defray plate manufacturing and plate processing 14 15 costs for the issuance and, when applicable, renewal of any new 16 or existing special registration plates authorized under this 17 Code and (ii) for grants made by the Secretary of State to benefit Illinois Veterans Home libraries. 18

On or before October 1, 1995, the Secretary of State shall direct the State Comptroller and State Treasurer to transfer any unexpended balance in the Special Environmental License Plate Fund, the Special Korean War Veteran License Plate Fund, and the Retired Congressional License Plate Fund to the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund.

(1) The Motor Vehicle Review Board Fund is created as a 25 26 special fund in the State Treasury. Moneys deposited into the 27 Fund under paragraph (7) of subsection (b) of Section 5-101 and 28 Section 5-109 shall, subject to appropriation, be used by the 29 Office of the Secretary of State to administer the Motor 30 Vehicle Review Board, including without limitation payment of 31 compensation and all necessary expenses incurred in 32 administering the Motor Vehicle Review Board under the Motor Vehicle Franchise Act. 33

(m) Effective July 1, 1996, there is created in the State
 Treasury a special fund to be known as the Family
 Responsibility Fund. Moneys deposited into the Fund shall,

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subject to appropriation, be used by the Office of the
 Secretary of State for the purpose of enforcing the Family
 Financial Responsibility Law.

(n) The Illinois Fire Fighters' Memorial Fund is created as 4 5 a special fund in the State Treasury. Moneys deposited into the Fund shall, subject to appropriation, be used by the Office of 6 7 the State Fire Marshal for construction of the Illinois Fire 8 Fighters' Memorial to be located at the State Capitol grounds in Springfield, Illinois. Upon the completion of the Memorial, 9 10 moneys in the Fund shall be used in accordance with Section 3-634. 11

(o) Of the money collected for each certificate of title
for all-terrain vehicles and off-highway motorcycles, \$17
shall be deposited into the Off-Highway Vehicle Trails Fund.
