AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 92 1 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend Senate Bill 92, AS AMENDED, by 3 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the 4 following: "Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by 5 6 changing Section 3-2-5 and adding Section 3-2-5.1 as follows: 7 (730 ILCS 5/3-2-5) (from Ch. 38, par. 1003-2-5) 8 3-2-5. Organization of the Department; Adult Department of Corrections and the Department of Juvenile 9 10 Justice. (a) There shall be an Adult Division within the Department 11 which shall be administered by an Assistant Director appointed 12 by the Governor under The Civil Administrative Code of 13 Illinois. The Assistant Director shall be under the direction 14 of the Director. The Adult Division shall be responsible for 15 16 all persons committed or transferred to the Department under Sections 3-10-7 or 5-8-6 of this Code. 17 (b) There shall be a Department of Juvenile Justice which 18 shall be administered by a Director appointed by the Governor 19 under the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. The Department 20 21 of Juvenile Justice shall be responsible for all persons committed to the Department of Corrections under Section 5-8-6 22 of this Code, Section 5-10 of the Juvenile Court Act, or 23

Section 5-750 of the Juvenile Court Act of 1987. Youth

committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice pursuant to this Code shall be sight and sound separate from youth committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice pursuant to the Juvenile Court Act. There shall be a Juvenile Division within the Department which shall be administered by an Assistant Director appointed by the Governor under The Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. The Assistant Director shall under the direction of the Director. The Juvenile Division shall be responsible for all persons committed to the Juvenile Division of the Department under Section 5-8-6 of this Code or etion 5-10 of the Juvenile Court Act or Section 5-750 of the Juvenile Court Act of 1987.

Department of Juvenile Justice personnel who are first employed by the Department after January 1, 2006 and who provide counseling, educational, vocational, or treatment services directly to juveniles must be over the age of 21 and have graduated from an accredited 4-year college or university with a specialization in criminal justice, education, psychology, sociology, social work, or a closely related social science. Work experience in a residential treatment program that includes supervision or counseling of troubled youth between 10 and 17 years of age may be substituted on a year-for-year basis for the stated education specialization requirement.

(c) The Department shall create a gang intelligence unit under the supervision of the Director. The unit shall be specifically designed to gather information regarding the inmate gang population, monitor the activities of gangs, and prevent the furtherance of gang activities through the development and implementation of policies aimed at deterring gang activity. The Director shall appoint a Corrections Intelligence Coordinator.

All information collected and maintained by the unit shall be highly confidential, and access to that information shall be

restricted by the Department. The information shall be used to 1 control and limit the activities of gangs within correctional 2 3 institutions under the jurisdiction of the Illinois Department 4 of Corrections and may be shared with other law enforcement 5 agencies in order to curb gang activities outside of correctional institutions under the jurisdiction of the 6 7 Department and to assist in the investigations and prosecutions 8 of gang activity. The Department shall establish and promulgate rules governing the release of information to outside law 9 10 enforcement agencies. Due to the highly sensitive nature of the 11 information, the information is exempt from requests for disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act as the 12 13 information contained is highly confidential and may be harmful if disclosed. 14

The Department shall file an annual report with the General Assembly on the profile of the inmate population associated gangs, gang-related activity within correctional institutions under the jurisdiction of the Department, and an overall status of the unit as it relates to its function and performance.

Sec. 3-2-5.1. Department of Juvenile Justice Transition 23 24 Plan.

The Department of Juvenile Justice shall assume the rights, powers, duties, and responsibilities of the Juvenile Division of the Department of Corrections. Personnel, books, records, property, and unencumbered appropriations pertaining to the Juvenile Division of the Department of Corrections shall be transferred to the Department of Juvenile Justice, effective January 1, 2006. Any rights of employees or the State under the Personnel Code or any other contract or plan shall be unaffected by this transfer.

- 1 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January
- 2 1, 2006.".
