Amends the Unified Code of Corrections. Provides that a prisoner performing a work assignment in a correctional employment program shall receive a daily wage of \$25 or a higher amount determined by administrative rule of the Department of Corrections.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by
changing Section 3-12-5 as follows:

6 (730 ILCS 5/3-12-5) (from Ch. 38, par. 1003-12-5)

7 Sec. 3-12-5. Compensation. A person Persons performing a work assignment under subsection (a) of Section 3-12-2 shall 8 may receive a wage of \$25 per day or a higher amount 9 wages under rules and regulations of 10 established the Department. In determining rates of compensation if more than 11 \$25 per day, the Department shall consider the effort, skill 12 and economic value of the work performed. Compensation may be 13 14 given to persons who participate in other programs of the 15 Department. Of the compensation earned pursuant to this Section, a portion, as determined by the Department, shall be 16 17 offset the cost of the committed used to person's incarceration. If the committed person files a lawsuit 18 19 determined frivolous under Article XXII of the Code of Civil Procedure, 50% of the compensation shall be used to offset the 20 filing fees and costs of the lawsuit as provided in that 21 22 Article until all fees and costs are paid in full. All other wages shall be deposited in the individual's account under 23 rules and regulations of the Department. The Department shall 24 25 notify the Attorney General of any compensation applied towards 26 a satisfaction, in whole or in part, of the person's 27 incarceration costs.
