SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/2-3.137 new 105 ILCS 5/3-14.20

from Ch. 122, par. 3-14.20

Amends the School Code. Requires the State Board of Education to adopt rules for the documentation of school plan reviews and inspections of school facilities and to convene a task force for the purpose of reviewing these documents and making recommendations regarding training and accreditation of individuals performing reviews or inspections. In a Section requiring school building plans and specifications to be approved by the regional superintendent of schools, removes the provision allowing the local fire department or fire protection district to request a review of the plans and specifications. Provides for review of the plans and specifications by a municipality, fire protection district, or county. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
2-3.137 and changing Section 3-14.20 as follows:

Sec. 2-3.137. Inspection and review of school facilities;
task force.

9 <u>(a) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the</u> 10 <u>documentation of school plan reviews and inspections of school</u> 11 <u>facilities, including the responsible individual's signature.</u> 12 <u>Such documents shall be kept on file by the regional</u> 13 superintendent of schools.

14 (b) The State Board of Education shall convene a task force 15 for the purpose of reviewing the documents required under rules adopted under subsection (a) of this Section and making 16 recommendations regarding training and accreditation of 17 individuals performing reviews or inspections required under 18 19 Section 2-3.12, 3-14.20, 3-14.21, or 3-14.22 of this Code, including regional superintendents of schools and others 20 performing reviews or inspections under the authority of a 21 regional superintendent (such as consultants, municipalities, 22 23 and fire protection districts).

24 <u>The task force shall consist of all of the following</u> 25 members:

26	(1) The Executive Director of the Capital Development
27	Board or his or her designee and a staff representative of
28	the Division of Building Codes and Regulations.
29	(2) The State Superintendent of Education or his or her

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(3) A person appointed by the State Board of Education.(4) A person appointed by an organization representing

7	regional superintendents of schools.

18	The task force shall issue a report of its findings to the
19	Governor and the General Assembly no later than June 30, 2005.

21	Sec. 3-14.20. Building plans and specifications. To
22	inspect the building plans and specifications, including but
23	not limited to plans and specifications for the heating,
24	ventilating, lighting, seating, water supply, toilets and
25	safety against fire of public school rooms and buildings
26	submitted to him by school boards, and to approve all those
27	which comply substantially with the building code authorized in
28	Section 2-3.12.
29	If a municipality or, in the case of an unincorporated
30	area, a county or, if applicable, a fire protection district
31	wishes to be notified of plans and specifications received by a
32	regional office of education for any future construction or
33	alteration of a public school facility located within that
34	entity's jurisdiction, then the entity must register this wish

35 with the regional superintendent of schools. Within 10 days

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1 after the regional superintendent of schools receives the plans 2 and specifications from a school board and prior to the bidding process, he or she shall notify, in writing, the registered 3 municipality and, if applicable, the registered fire 4 5 protection district where the school that is being constructed or altered lies that plans and specifications have been 6 received. In the case of an unincorporated area, the registered 7 county shall be notified. If the municipality, fire protection 8 9 district, or county requests a review of the plans and specifications, then the school board shall submit a copy of 10 11 the plans and specifications. The municipality and, if 12 applicable, the fire protection district or the county may comment in writing on the plans and specifications based on the 13 building code authorized in Section 2-3.12, referencing the 14 specific code where a discrepancy has been identified, and 15 16 respond back to the regional superintendent of schools within 17 15 days after a copy of the plans and specifications have been received or, if needed for plan review, such additional time as 18 agreed to by the regional superintendent of schools. This 19 20 review must be at no cost to the school district. The local fire department or fire protection district where the school is 21 22 being constructed or altered may request a review of the plans and specifications. The regional superintendent of schools 23 shall submit a copy of the plans and specifications within 10 24 business days after the request. The fire department or fire 25 26 protection district may comment on the plans and specifications 27 based on the building code authorized in Section 2 3.12 28 Code and, if any corrective action must be taken, shall 29 the regional superintendent of schools within 15 days after 30 receipt of the plans and specifications. The Office of the 31 State Fire Marshal may review the plans and specifications at 32 the request of the fire department or fire protection district. The review must be conducted at no cost to the school district. 33 34 If such plans and specifications are not approved or denied approval by the regional superintendent of schools within 3 35 months after the date on which they are submitted to him or 36
