AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 662 1 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend Senate Bill 662, AS AMENDED, by 3 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the 4 following: 5 "Section 5. The Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Administrative Act is amended by changing Section 6 18.4 as follows: 8 (20 ILCS 1705/18.4) Sec. 18.4. Community Mental Health Medicaid Trust Fund; 9 10 reimbursement. (a) The Community Mental Health Medicaid Trust Fund is 11 hereby created in the State Treasury. 12 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Section, effective 13 in the first fiscal year following repayment of interfund 14 transfers under subsection (b-1), the first \$73,000,000 any 15 16 funds paid to the State by the federal government under Title XIX or Title XXI of the Social Security Act for that year's 17 18 services delivered by community mental health services 19 providers, and any interest earned thereon, shall be deposited directly into the Community Mental Health Medicaid Trust Fund. 20 21 The next \$25,000,000 shall be deposited Beginning with State fiscal year 2005, the first \$95,000,000 received by the 22 Department shall be deposited 26.3%—into the General Revenue 23 Fund and 73.7% into the Community Mental Health Medicaid Trust 24

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Fund. Amounts received in excess of \$98,000,000 \$95,000,000 in 1 any State fiscal year after fiscal year 2006 shall be deposited 2 3 50% into the General Revenue Fund and 50% into the Community 4 Mental Health Medicaid Trust Fund. The Department shall analyze the budgeting and programmatic impact of this funding 5 allocation and report to the Governor and the General Assembly 6 7 the results of this analysis and any recommendations for

change, no later than December 31, 2005.

(b-1) For State fiscal year 2005 services, the first \$73,000,000 in any funds paid to the State by the federal government under Title XIX or Title XXI of the Social Security Act for services delivered by community mental health services providers, and any interest earned thereon, shall be deposited directly into the Community Mental Health Trust Fund before any deposits are made into the General Revenue Fund. The next \$25,000,000 shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund. Amounts received in excess of \$98,000,000 shall be deposited 50% into the General Revenue Fund and 50% into the Community Mental Health Medicaid Trust Fund. On April 1, 2005, or as soon thereafter as practical, the Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer amounts not to exceed \$14,000,000 into the Community Mental Health Medicaid Fund from the General Revenue Fund.

(b-2) For State fiscal year 2006 services, and in subsequent fiscal years until any transfers under subsection (b-1) are repaid, the first \$73,000,000 in any funds paid to the State by the federal government under Title XIX or Title XXI of the Social Security Act for services delivered by community mental health services providers, and any interest earned thereon, shall be deposited directly into the Community Mental Health Trust Fund. Then the next \$14,000,000, or such amount as was transferred under subsection (b-1), shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund. The next \$25,000,000 shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund. Any

- 1 additional amounts received shall be deposited 50% into the
- 2 General Revenue Fund and 50% into the Community Mental Health
- 3 Medicaid Trust Fund.
- 4 (c) The Department shall reimburse community mental health
- 5 services providers for Medicaid-reimbursed mental health
- 6 services provided to eligible individuals. Moneys in the
- 7 Community Mental Health Medicaid Trust Fund may be used for
- 8 that purpose.
- 9 (d) As used in this Section:
- 10 "Medicaid-reimbursed mental health services" means
- 11 services provided by a community mental health provider under
- 12 an agreement with the Department that is eligible for
- 13 reimbursement under the federal Title XIX program or Title XXI
- 14 program.
- "Provider" means a community agency that is funded by the
- Department to provide a Medicaid-reimbursed service.
- "Services" means mental health services provided under one
- of the following programs:
- 19 (1) Medicaid Clinic Option;
- 20 (2) Medicaid Rehabilitation Option;
- 21 (3) Targeted Case Management.

- 23 Section 10. The State Finance Act is amended by changing
- 24 Section 8g as follows:

- Sec. 8g. Fund transfers.
- 27 (a) In addition to any other transfers that may be provided
- for by law, as soon as may be practical after the effective
- 29 date of this amendatory Act of the 91st General Assembly, the
- 30 State Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall
- 31 transfer the sum of \$10,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund
- 32 to the Motor Vehicle License Plate Fund created by Senate Bill

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- 1028 of the 91st General Assembly.
 - (b) In addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by law, as soon as may be practical after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 91st General Assembly, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer the sum of \$25,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Fund for Illinois' Future created by Senate Bill 1066 of the 91st General Assembly.
 - (c) In addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by law, on August 30 of each fiscal year's license period, the Illinois Liquor Control Commission shall direct and the State Comptroller and State Treasurer shall transfer from the General Revenue Fund to the Youth Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Prevention Fund an amount equal to the number of retail liquor licenses issued for that fiscal year multiplied by \$50.
 - (d) The payments to programs required under subsection (d) of Section 28.1 of the Horse Racing Act of 1975 shall be made, pursuant to appropriation, from the special funds referred to in the statutes cited in that subsection, rather than directly from the General Revenue Fund.
- Beginning January 1, 2000, on the first day of each month, soon as may be practical thereafter, the State or as Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer from the General Revenue Fund to each of the special funds from which payments are to be made under Section 28.1(d) of the Horse Racing Act of 1975 an amount equal to 1/12 of the annual amount required for those payments from that special fund, which annual amount shall not exceed the annual amount for those payments from that special fund for the calendar year 1998. The special funds to which transfers shall be made under this subsection (d) include, but are not necessarily limited to, the Agricultural Premium Fund; the Metropolitan Exposition Auditorium and Office Building Fund; the Fair and Exposition Fund; the Standardbred Breeders Fund; the Thoroughbred

- 1 Breeders Fund; and the Illinois Veterans' Rehabilitation Fund.

- 6 shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer the sum of
- 7 \$15,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Fund for
- 8 Illinois' Future.

- 21 to the Long-Term Care Provider Fund.
- 22 (g) In addition to any other transfers that may be provided
- for by law, on July 1, 2001, or as soon thereafter as may be
- 24 practical, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State
- 25 Treasurer shall transfer the sum of \$1,200,000 from the General
- 26 Revenue Fund to the Violence Prevention Fund.
- (h) In each of fiscal years 2002 through 2004, but not
- thereafter, in addition to any other transfers that may be
- 29 provided for by law, the State Comptroller shall direct and the
- 30 State Treasurer shall transfer \$5,000,000 from the General
- 31 Revenue Fund to the Tourism Promotion Fund.
- 32 (i) On or after July 1, 2001 and until May 1, 2002, in
- 33 addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by
- law, at the direction of and upon notification from the

Governor, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State
Treasurer shall transfer amounts not exceeding a total of
\$80,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Tobacco
Settlement Recovery Fund. Any amounts so transferred shall be
re-transferred by the State Comptroller and the State Treasurer
from the Tobacco Settlement Recovery Fund to the General
Revenue Fund at the direction of and upon notification from the

Governor, but in any event on or before June 30, 2002.

(i-1) On or after July 1, 2002 and until May 1, 2003, in addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by law, at the direction of and upon notification from the Governor, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer amounts not exceeding a total of \$80,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Tobacco Settlement Recovery Fund. Any amounts so transferred shall be re-transferred by the State Comptroller and the State Treasurer from the Tobacco Settlement Recovery Fund to the General Revenue Fund at the direction of and upon notification from the Governor, but in any event on or before June 30, 2003.

(j) On or after July 1, 2001 and no later than June 30, 2002, in addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by law, at the direction of and upon notification from the Governor, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer amounts not to exceed the following sums into the Statistical Services Revolving Fund:

31	(k-3) On or after July 1, 2002 and no later than June 30,
32	2003, in addition to any other transfers that may be provided
33	for by law, at the direction of and upon notification from the
34	Governor, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State

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(o) On or after July 1, 2003, and no later than June 30,

2 for by law, at the direction of and upon notification from the

3 Governor, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State

4 Treasurer shall transfer amounts not to exceed the following

5 sums into the Vehicle Inspection Fund:

From the Underground Storage Tank Fund \$35,000,000.

- (p) On or after July 1, 2003 and until May 1, 2004, in addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by law, at the direction of and upon notification from the Governor, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer amounts not exceeding a total of \$80,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Tobacco Settlement Recovery Fund. Any amounts so transferred shall be re-transferred from the Tobacco Settlement Recovery Fund to the General Revenue Fund at the direction of and upon notification from the Governor, but in any event on or before June 30, 2004.
- (q) In addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by law, on July 1, 2003, or as soon as may be practical thereafter, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer the sum of \$5,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Military Family Relief Fund.
- (r) In addition to any other transfers that may be provided for by law, on July 1, 2003, or as soon as may be practical thereafter, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State Treasurer shall transfer the sum of \$1,922,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Presidential Library and Museum Operating Fund.
