AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 916 1 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend Senate Bill 916 by replacing 3 everything after the enacting clause with the following: 4 "Section 5. The Illinois Insurance Code is amended by 5 adding Section 368f as follows: (215 ILCS 5/368f new) 6 7 Sec. 368f. Military service member insurance 8 reinstatement. (a) No Illinois resident activated for military service and 9 no spouse or dependent of the resident who becomes eligible for 10 a federal government-sponsored health insurance program, 11 including the TriCare program providing coverage for civilian 12 dependents of military personnel, as a result of the activation 13 shall be denied reinstatement into the same individual health 14 15 insurance coverage with the health insurer that the resident 16 lapsed as a result of activation or becoming covered by the federal government-sponsored health insurance program. The 17 resident shall have the right to reinstatement in the same 18 individual health insurance coverage without medical 19 underwriting, subject to payment of the current premium charged 20 21 to other persons of the same age and gender that are covered 22 under the same individual health coverage. Except in the case of birth or adoption that occurs during the period of 23

activation, reinstatement must be into the same coverage type

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as the resident held prior to lapsing the individual health 1 2 insurance coverage and at the same or, at the option of the 3 resident, higher deductible level. The reinstatement rights provided under this subsection (a) are not available to a 4 5 resident or dependents if the activated person is discharged from the military under other than honorable conditions. 6 7 (b) The health insurer with which the reinstatement is

- being requested must receive a request for reinstatement no later than 63 days following the later of (i) deactivation or (ii) loss of coverage under the federal government-sponsored health insurance program. The health insurer may request proof of loss of coverage and the timing of the loss of coverage of the government-sponsored coverage in order to determine eligibility for reinstatement into the individual coverage. The effective date of the reinstatement of individual health coverage shall be the first of the month following receipt of the notice requesting reinstatement.
- (c) All insurers must provide written notice to the policyholder of individual health coverage of the rights described in subsection (a) of this Section. In lieu of the inclusion of the notice in the individual health insurance policy, an insurance company may satisfy the notification requirement by providing a single written notice:
 - (1) in conjunction with the enrollment process for a policyholder initially enrolling in the individual coverage on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly; or
 - (2) by mailing written notice to policyholders whose coverage was effective prior to the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly no later than 90 days following the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly.
- 33 (d) The provisions of subsection (a) of this Section do not apply to any policy or certificate providing coverage for any

- 2 coverage, credit, dental, disability income, hospital
- 3 indemnity, long-term care, Medicare supplement, vision care,
- or short-term nonrenewable health policy or other 4
- 5 limited-benefit supplemental insurance, or any coverage issued
- as a supplement to any liability insurance, workers' 6
- 7 compensation or similar insurance, or any insurance under which
- benefits are payable with or without regard to fault, whether 8
- written on a group, blanket, or individual basis. 9
- 10 (e) Nothing in this Section shall require an insurer to
- reinstate the resident if the insurer requires residency in an 11
- enrollment area and those residency requirements are not met 12
- after deactivation or loss of coverage under the 13
- government-sponsored health insurance program. 14
- (f) All terms, conditions, and limitations of the 15
- individual coverage into which reinstatement is made apply 16
- equally to all insureds enrolled in the coverage. 17
- 18 (g) The Secretary may adopt rules as may be necessary to
- carry out the provisions of this Section. 19

- 21 becoming law.".
