## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

ARTICLE 1 4 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much 5 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects 6 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated from the 7 8 General Revenue Fund to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor: 9 GENERAL OFFICE 10 For Personal Services ...... 960,000 11 For Employee Retirement Contributions 12 13 Paid by Employer ......0 For State Contributions to State 14 15 For State Contributions to 16 17 For Contractual Services ......410,000 18 19 20 21 2.2 23 For Electronic Data Processing ......40,000 24 25 For Operational and Grant Expenses of the 2.6 For Ordinary and Contingent Expenses of 27 The Illinois River Coordination Council ......190,000 28 29 Total \$2,392,700

Section 10. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as

- 1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Agricultural
- 2 Premium Fund to the Office of Lieutenant Governor for all
- 3 costs associated with the Rural Affairs Council including any
- 4 grants or administration expenses.
- 5 Section 15. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as
- 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Lieutenant
- 7 Governor's Grant Fund to the Office of Lieutenant Governor to
- 8 be expended in accordance with the terms and conditions upon
- 9 which such funds were received and in the exercise of the
- 10 powers or performance of the duties of the Office of the
- 11 Lieutenant Governor.
- 12 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
- 13 2005.
