1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
- 5 27-6 as follows:

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- 6 (105 ILCS 5/27-6) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-6)
- Sec. 27-6. Courses in physical education Special activities.
- Pupils enrolled in the public schools and State 9 universities engaged in preparing teachers shall, as soon as 10 practicable, be required to engage daily, during the school 11 day, in courses of physical education for such periods as are 12 compatible with the optimum growth and development needs of 13 14 individuals at the various age levels except when appropriate 15 excuses are submitted to the school by a pupil's parent or guardian or by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act 16 17 of 1987 and except as provided in subsection (b) of this 18 Section.
 - Special activities in physical education shall be provided for pupils whose physical or emotional condition, as determined by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, prevents their participation in the courses provided for normal children.
- (b) A school board is authorized to excuse pupils enrolled 24 25 in grades 11 and 12 from engaging in physical education courses 26 if those pupils request to be excused for any of the following reasons: (1) for ongoing participation in an interscholastic 27 athletic program; (2) to enroll in academic classes which are 28 required for admission to an institution of higher learning, 29 30 provided that failure to take such classes will result in the pupil being denied admission to the institution of his or her 31 32 choice; or (3) to enroll in academic classes which are required

- 1 for graduation from high school, provided that failure to take 2 such classes will result in the pupil being unable to graduate. 3 A school board may also excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 enrolled in a marching band program for credit from engaging in 4 5 physical education courses if those pupils request to be 6 excused for ongoing participation in such marching band program. A school board may also excuse pupils in grades 9 7 8 through 12 enrolled in a Reserve Officer's Training Corps (ROTC) program sponsored by the school district from engaging 9 in physical education courses. A school board may also excuse 10 pupils in grades 9 through 12 from engaging in physical 11 education courses if (i) the pupil is getting substantial 12 13 physical activity from participating in athletic training and competition in a sport under the auspices of a national 14 governing board that is recognized by and affiliated with an 15 16 international sports federation, (ii) the pupil has 17 competitively placed in the top 10 of the competitors in State, regional, or national competitions of the sport, (iii) the 18 parent or guardian has provided documentation of such training 19 20 and recognition, and (iv) the pupil completes alternative coursework in physical education, as determined by the school 21 22 district. School boards which choose to exercise this authority 23 shall establish a policy to excuse pupils on an individual 24 basis.
