## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-6

from Ch. 122, par. 27-6

Amends the School Code. With respect to a pupil whom a school board has exempted from the requirement that the pupil engage daily in physical education because he or she must utilize the time set aside for physical education to receive special education support and services, provides that the pupil's individualized education program team makes the determination that the pupil must utilize the time set aside for physical education to receive special education support and services. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
27-6 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/27-6) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-6)

Sec. 27-6. Courses in physical education required; special
activities.

Pupils enrolled in the public schools and State 9 (a) universities engaged in preparing teachers shall be required to 10 engage daily during the school day, except on block scheduled 11 days for those public schools engaged in block scheduling, in 12 courses of physical education for such periods as are 13 14 compatible with the optimum growth and developmental needs of 15 individuals at the various age levels except when appropriate excuses are submitted to the school by a pupil's parent or 16 17 guardian or by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987 and except as provided in subsection (b) of this 18 19 Section.

20 Special activities in physical education shall be provided 21 for pupils whose physical or emotional condition, as determined 22 by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, 23 prevents their participation in the courses provided for normal 24 children.

25 (b) A school board is authorized to excuse pupils enrolled 26 in grades 11 and 12 from engaging in physical education courses if those pupils request to be excused for any of the following 27 reasons: (1) for ongoing participation in an interscholastic 28 athletic program; (2) to enroll in academic classes which are 29 30 required for admission to an institution of higher learning, provided that failure to take such classes will result in the 31 pupil being denied admission to the institution of his or her 32

1 choice; or (3) to enroll in academic classes which are required 2 for graduation from high school, provided that failure to take 3 such classes will result in the pupil being unable to graduate. A school board may also excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 4 5 enrolled in a marching band program for credit from engaging in physical education courses if those pupils request to be 6 excused for ongoing participation in such marching band 7 8 program. In addition, a school board may excuse <u>a pupil</u> pupils 9 in any of grades 9 through 12 if the pupil's individualized education program team determines that he or she those pupils 10 11 must utilize the time set aside for physical education to 12 receive special education support and services. A school board 13 may also excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 enrolled in a Reserve Officer's Training Corps (ROTC) program sponsored by 14 15 the school district from engaging in physical education courses. School boards which choose to exercise this authority 16 17 shall establish a policy to excuse pupils on an individual basis. 18

(c) The provisions of this Section are subject to theprovisions of Section 27-22.05.
