SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 2905/2	from Ch.	127	1/2,	par.	2
20 ILCS 2910/1	from Ch.	127	1/2,	par.	501

Amends the State Fire Marshal Act and the Peace Officer Fire Investigation Act to allow arson investigators of the State Fire Marshal designated State Fire Marshal Special Agents to exercise peace officer powers and carry weapons at all times, rather than only in the course of arson investigations. Sets forth that these Special Agents may exercise these powers and carry weapons at all times, but only if they have satisfactorily completed (1) a training course approved by the Department of State Police that substantially conforms to the standards promulgated pursuant to the Peace Officer Firearm Training Act and (2) a course in fire and arson investigation approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshal pursuant to the Illinois Fire Protection Training Act. Provides that this authorization applies only to State Fire Marshal Special Agents excluding any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other employee of the Federal government; any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other employee of any unit of local government; or any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other employee of the State of Illinois other than an employee of the Office of the State Fire Marshal assigned to investigate arson. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The State Fire Marshal Act is amended by 5 changing Section 2 as follows:

(20 ILCS 2905/2) (from Ch. 127 1/2, par. 2)

7 Sec. 2. The Office shall have the following powers and 8 duties:

1. To exercise the rights, powers and duties which have 9 been vested by law in the Department of State Police as the 10 successor of the Department of Public Safety, State Fire 11 Marshal, inspectors, officers and employees of the State Fire 12 Marshal, including arson investigation. Arson investigations 13 14 shall be conducted by State Fire Marshal Special Agents, who 15 shall be peace officers as provided in the Peace Officer Fire Investigation Act. 16

17 2. To keep a record, as may be required by law, of all
18 fires occurring in the State, together with all facts,
19 statistics and circumstances, including the origin of fires.

3. To exercise the rights, powers and duties which have been vested in the Department of State Police by the "Boiler and Pressure Vessel Safety Act", approved August 7, 1951, as amended.

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4. To administer the Illinois Fire Protection Training Act.

5. To aid in the establishment and maintenance of the training facilities and programs of the Illinois Fire Service Institute.

28 6. To disburse Federal grants for fire protection purposes29 to units of local government.

30 7. To pay to or in behalf of the City of Chicago for the 31 maintenance, expenses, facilities and structures directly 32 incident to the Chicago Fire Department training program. Such - 2 - LRB094 17123 RSP 52410 b

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1 payments may be made either as reimbursements for expenditures 2 previously made by the City, or as payments at the time the 3 City has incurred an obligation which is then due and payable for such expenditures. Payments for the Chicago Fire Department 4 5 training program shall be made only for those expenditures 6 which are not claimable by the City under "An Act relating to fire protection training", certified November 9, 1971, as 7 amended. 8

9 8. To administer General Revenue Fund grants to areas not 10 located in a fire protection district or in a municipality 11 which provides fire protection services, to defray the 12 organizational expenses of forming a fire protection district.

9. cooperation the Illinois 13 In with Environmental administer the Illinois Leaking Protection Agency, to 14 Underground Storage Tank program in accordance with Section 4 15 of this Act and Section 22.12 of the Environmental Protection 16 17 Act.

18 10. To expend state and federal funds as appropriated by19 the General Assembly.

11. To provide technical assistance, to areas not located in a fire protection district or in a municipality which provides fire protection service, to form a fire protection district, to join an existing district, or to establish a municipal fire department, whichever is applicable.

12. To exercise such other powers and duties as may bevested in the Office by law.

28 Section 10. The Peace Officer Fire Investigation Act is 29 amended by changing Section 1 as follows:

30 (20 ILCS 2910/1) (from Ch. 127 1/2, par. 501)

31 Sec. 1. Peace Officer Status.

(a) Any person who is a sworn member of any organized and
 paid fire department of a political subdivision of this State
 and is authorized to investigate fires or explosions for such

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political subdivision and, or who is employed by the Office of 1 2 the State Fire Marshal to determine the cause, origin and 3 circumstances of such fires or explosions that are suspected to 4 be arson or arson-related crimes, may be classified as a peace 5 officer by the political subdivision or agency employing such 6 person. A person so classified shall possess the same powers of 7 arrest, search and seizure and the securing and service of 8 warrants as sheriffs of counties, and police officers within 9 the jurisdiction of their political subdivision. While in the 10 actual investigation and matters incident thereto, such person 11 may carry weapons as may be necessary, but only if that person 12 has satisfactorily completed (1) a training program offered or 13 approved by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board which substantially conforms to standards promulgated 14 15 pursuant to the Illinois Police Training Act and the Peace 16 Officer Firearm Training Act "An Act in relation to firearms 17 training for peace officers", approved August 29, 1975, amended; or in the case of employees of the Office of the State 18 19 Fire Marshal, a training course approved by the Department of State Police which also substantially conforms to standards 20 promulgated pursuant to "An Act in relation to firearms 21 training for peace officers", approved August 29, 1975, as 22 23 amended; and (2) a course in fire and arson investigation approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshal pursuant to 24 the Illinois Fire Protection Training Act. Such training need 25 26 not include exposure to vehicle and traffic law, traffic 27 control and accident investigation, or first aid, but shall 28 include training in the law relating to the rights of persons suspected of involvement in criminal activities. 29

Any person granted the powers enumerated in this <u>subsection</u> (a) <u>Section</u> may exercise such powers only during the actual investigation of the cause, origin and circumstances of such fires or explosions that are suspected to be arson or arson-related crimes.

35 (b) <u>Persons employed by the Office of the State Fire</u> 36 <u>Marshal to conduct arson investigations shall be designated</u> SB2918

1 State Fire Marshal Special Agents and shall be peace officers 2 with all of the powers of peace officers in cities and sheriffs in counties, except that they may exercise those powers 3 throughout the State. These Special Agents may exercise these 4 5 powers and carry weapons at all times, but only if they have satisfactorily completed (1) a training course approved by the 6 Department of State Police that substantially conforms to the 7 standards promulgated pursuant to the Peace Officer Firearm 8 9 Training Act and (2) a course in fire and arson investigation approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshal pursuant to 10 11 the Illinois Fire Protection Training Act. Such training need 12 not include exposure to vehicle and traffic law, traffic control and accident investigation, or first aid, but shall 13 include training in the law relating to the rights of persons 14 suspected of involvement in criminal activities. 15

16 For purposes of this subsection (b), a "State Fire Marshal 17 Special Agent" does not include any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other employee of the Federal government; 18 any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other 19 20 employee of any unit of local government; or any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other employee of the 21 State of Illinois other than an employee of the Office of the 22 23 State Fire Marshal assigned to investigate arson.

The State Fire Marshal must authorize to each employee of 24 the Office of the State Fire Marshal who is exercising the 25 powers of a peace officer a distinct badge that, on its face, 26 27 (i) clearly states that the badge is authorized by the Office 28 State Fire Marshal and (ii) contains of the a unique identifying number. No other badge shall be authorized by the 29 30 Office of the State Fire Marshal, except that a badge, 31 different from the badge issued to peace officers, may be 32 authorized by the Office of the State Fire Marshal for the use of fire prevention inspectors employed by that Office. Nothing 33 in this subsection prohibits the State Fire Marshal from 34 35 issuing shields or other distinctive identification to 36 employees not exercising the powers of a peace officer if the SB2918 - 5 - LRB094 17123 RSP 52410 b

State Fire Marshal determines that a shield or distinctive
 identification is needed by the employee to carry out his or
 her responsibilities.
