SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the State of Illinois 3 were grieved to learn of the death of Thomas Earl Robinson on 4 Saturday, February 5, 2005; and

WHEREAS, He was born on September 27, 1940, the son of Wade Robinson and Beatrice Ross, in Mangham, Louisiana; he attended Catholic elementary schools in Louisiana; after moving to Chicago, he graduated from Crane High School and then worked as a delivery person for Black's Pharmacy; and

WHEREAS, On February 17, 1964, Mr. Robinson enlisted in the Army and valiantly served his country during the Vietnam War as a military policeman; he received two marksman medals and a National Defense Service Medal before his discharge on February 3, 1967; he remained active as a member of the American Legion; and

WHEREAS, After he was discharged, he returned to Chicago and worked as a Chicago Transit Authority bus driver while attending Kennedy-King College at night; on his bus route, he met Lola Jean Marruffo; she became his wife on October 13, 1970; they had two children, Stephanie Nicole Robinson and Anthony Earl Robinson; the family attended Little Flower Church; and

WHEREAS, In 1985, he began working at Horween Leather Company as a fireman; inspired by Stephanie's impending college graduation, he decided to complete his education, and in 1996, he became a stationary engineer; he retired from Horween Leather Company in 2005; and

WHEREAS, The passing of Thomas Earl Robinson has been deeply felt by many, especially his mother, Beatrice Sam; his stepfather, Harry Sam; his longtime friend, Myra Phillips; his
