WHEREAS, He was born on May 8, 1906, in St. Louis to John G. Doerr and Mary Vahle Doerr; he lived in Alton all his life and was a veteran of World War II, serving in the U.S. Army as an amphibious engineer, Second Brigade, in the South Pacific for 26 months; he was awarded two Bronze Stars for his actions during that campaign; and

WHEREAS, He was an employee of Olin Brass Mill for 37 years and was in charge of quality control at the time of his retirement in July of 1967; an avid golfer and fisherman, he traveled to Egypt with his niece in 1993 for a 10-day tour down the Nile River, visiting the Great Pyramids, King Tut's tomb, and the Egyptian Museum, a highlight of his travels, which were many; he loved the Rams, the Illini, and the Kentucky Derby; and

WHEREAS, He was the pillar of his family with a great love of family heritage and often shared stories from his family's past; he will be greatly missed, but family memories are preserved thanks to his willingness to protect the past for future generations; and

WHEREAS, The passing of John H.
