Carmel High School, where he was salutatorian of his 11 graduating class, and a member of the scholastic bowl, debate, 12 math competition, and cross country teams; he was also a member 13 of the Forensic Society and the National Honor Society, which 14 he served as president for one year; and

15 WHEREAS, During his time at Mt. Carmel High School, he was 16 involved with the Link Unlimited organization, which provided 17 support systems for African American students in urban areas of 18 Chicago; and

19 WHEREAS, He went on to study at Princeton University in the 20 Department of Politics and planned on becoming a lawyer; at 21 Princeton, he was involved in the Whig-Cliosophic Society and 22 was a founding member of the Pre-Law Society, which he served 23 as president his sophomore year; he was also a peer academic 24 advisor; and
