Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Lottery Law is amended by changing

- 16 (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund
- 17 to be known as the "State Lottery Fund". Such fund shall
- 18 consist of all revenues received from (1) the sale of lottery

- 20 expenses that are directly proportionate to the sale of tickets
- or shares at the agent location, and prizes of less than \$600

- 16 (a) The Department shall offer a special instant
- scratch-off game with the title of "Quality of Life". The game 17
- shall commence on July 1, 2007 or as soon thereafter, in the 18
- discretion of the Director, as is reasonably practical, and 19
- 20 shall be discontinued on December 31, 2012. The operation of
- 21 the game is governed by this Act and by any rules adopted by
- 22 the Department. The Department must consult with the Quality of
- 23 Life Board, which is established under Section 2310-348 of the
- 24 Department of Public Health Powers and Duties Law of the Civil
- Administrative Code of Illinois, regarding the design and 25

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promotion of the game. If any provision of this Section is 1 2 inconsistent with any other provision of this Act, then this 3 Section governs.

(b) The Quality of Life Endowment Fund is created as a special fund in the State treasury. The net revenue from the Quality of Life special instant scratch-off game must be deposited into the Fund for appropriation by the General Assembly solely to the Department of Public Health for the purpose of HIV/AIDS-prevention education and for making grants to public or private entities in Illinois for the purpose of funding organizations that serve the highest at-risk categories for contracting HIV or developing AIDS. Grants shall be targeted to serve at-risk populations in proportion to the distribution of recent reported Illinois HIV/AIDS cases among risk groups as reported by the Illinois Department of Public Health. The recipient organizations must be engaged in HIV/AIDS-prevention education and HIV/AIDS healthcare treatment. The Department must, before grants are awarded, provide copies of all grant applications to the Quality of Life Board, receive and review the Board's recommendations and comments, and consult with the Board regarding the grants. Organizational size will determine an organization's competitive slot in the "Request for Proposal" process. Organizations with an annual budget of \$300,000 or less will compete with like size organizations for 50% of the Quality of Life annual fund. Organizations with an annual budget of

costs, or levies.

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- \$300,001 to \$700,000 will compete with like organizations for 1 2 25% of the Quality of Life annual fund, and organizations with 3 an annual budget of \$700,001 and upward will compete with like 4 organizations for 25% of the Quality of Life annual fund. The 5 lottery may designate a percentage of proceeds for marketing purposes. The grant funds may not be used for institutional, 6 organizational, or community-based overhead costs, indirect 7
 - Moneys received for the purposes of this Section, including, without limitation, net revenue from the special instant scratch-off game and gifts, grants, and awards from any public or private entity, must be deposited into the Fund. Any interest earned on moneys in the Fund <u>must be deposited into</u> the Fund.
 - For purposes of this subsection, "net revenue" means the total amount for which tickets have been sold less the sum of the amount paid out in prizes and the actual administrative expenses of the Department solely related to the Quality of Life game.
 - (c) During the time that tickets are sold for the Quality of Life game, the Department shall not unreasonably diminish the efforts devoted to marketing any other instant scratch-off lottery game.
 - (d) The Department may adopt any rules necessary to implement and administer the provisions of this Section in consultation with the Quality of Life Board.

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Section 10. The Department of Public Health Powers and 1 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is 2 3 amended by adding Section 2310-348 as follows:

(20 ILCS 2310/2310-348 new) 4

Sec. 2310-348. The Quality of Life Board.

(a) The Quality of Life Board is created as an advisory board within the Department. The Board shall consist of 11 members as follows: 2 members appointed by the President of the Senate; one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; 2 members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; 2 members appointed by the Governor, one of whom shall be designated as chair of the Board at the time of appointment; and 3 members appointed by the Director who represent organizations that advocate for the healthcare needs of the first and second highest HIV/AIDS risk groups, one each from the northern Illinois region, the central Illinois region, and the southern Illinois region.

The Board members shall serve one 2-year term. If a vacancy occurs in the Board membership, the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointment.

(b) Board members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their reasonable travel expenses from funds appropriated for that purpose. The Department shall provide

Section 8n of this Act, and (c), (d), or (e), notwithstanding 1 2 any other State law to the contrary, the Governor may, through 3 June 30, 2007, from time to time direct the State Treasurer and Comptroller to transfer a specified sum from any fund held by 5 the State Treasurer to the General Revenue Fund in order to help defray the State's operating costs for the fiscal year. 6 7 The total transfer under this Section from any fund in any 8 fiscal year shall not exceed the lesser of (i) 8% of the 9 revenues to be deposited into the fund during that fiscal year 10 or (ii) an amount that leaves a remaining fund balance of 25% 11 of the July 1 fund balance of that fiscal year. No 10 transfers may be made under this Section from the Pet 11 Population Control Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision 12 of this Section, for fiscal year 2004, the total transfer under 13 this Section from the Road Fund or the State Construction Account Fund shall not exceed the lesser of (i) 5% of the 14 15 revenues to be deposited into the fund during that fiscal year 16 or (ii) 25% of the beginning balance in the fund. For fiscal 17 year 2005 through fiscal year 2007, no amounts may be transferred under this Section from the Road Fund, the State 18 Construction Account Fund, the Criminal Justice Information 19 20 Systems Trust Fund, the Wireless Service Emergency Fund, or the Mandatory Arbitration Fund. 21

In determining the available balance in a fund, Governor may include receipts, transfers into the fund, and other resources anticipated to be available in the fund in that fiscal year.
