1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 420 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 420, AS AMENDED, by 2 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the 3 4 following: "Section 5. The Illinois Lottery Law is amended by changing 5 6 Sections 2 and 20 and by adding Section 21.7 as follows: 7 (20 ILCS 1605/2) (from Ch. 120, par. 1152) Sec. 2. This Act is enacted to implement and establish 8 within the State a lottery to be operated by the State, the 10 entire net proceeds of which are to be used for the support of the State's Common School Fund, except as provided in Sections 11 21.2, and 21.5, and 21.6, and 21.7. 12 (Source: P.A. 94-120, eff. 7-6-05; 94-585, eff. 8-15-05; 13 revised 8-23-05.) 14 (20 ILCS 1605/20) (from Ch. 120, par. 1170) 15

- 1 Sec. 20. State Lottery Fund.
- (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund 2
- to be known as the "State Lottery Fund". Such fund shall 3
- 4 consist of all revenues received from (1) the sale of lottery
- 5 tickets or shares, (net of commissions, fees representing those
- expenses that are directly proportionate to the sale of tickets 6
- or shares at the agent location, and prizes of less than \$600 7
- which have been validly paid at the agent level), (2) 8
- 9 application fees, and (3) all other sources including moneys
- 10 credited or transferred thereto from any other fund or source
- 11 pursuant to law. Interest earnings of the State Lottery Fund
- shall be credited to the Common School Fund. 12
- 13 (b) The receipt and distribution of moneys under Section
- 21.5 of this Act shall be in accordance with Section 21.5. 14
- 15 (c) (b) The receipt and distribution of moneys under
- 16 Section 21.6 of this Act shall be in accordance with Section

- Sec. 21.7. Go For The Gold scratch-off game. 23
- 24 (a) The Department shall offer a special instant
- scratch-off game with the title of "Go For The Gold". The game 25

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1 must commence on July 1, 2007 or as soon thereafter, in the discretion of the Director, as is reasonably practical. The 2 operation of the game is governed by this Act and by any rules 3 4 adopted by the Department. If any provision of this Section is 5 inconsistent with any other provision of this Act, then this Section governs. 6

(b) The net revenue from the Go For The Gold special instant scratch-off game must be deposited into the Special Olympics Illinois Fund for appropriation by the General Assembly solely to the Department of Human Services, which must distribute the moneys to Special Olympics Illinois to support the statewide training, competitions, and programs for present and future Special Olympics athletes. The moneys may not be used for institutional, organizational, or community-based overhead costs, indirect costs, or levies.

Moneys received for the purposes of this Section, including, without limitation, net revenue from the special instant scratch-off game and gifts, grants, and awards from any public or private entity, must be deposited into the Fund. Any interest earned on moneys in the Fund must be deposited into the Fund.

For purposes of this subsection, "net revenue" means the total amount for which tickets have been sold less the sum of the amount paid out in prizes and the actual administrative expenses of the Department solely related to the Go For The Gold game.

- The Gold game, the Department shall not unreasonably diminish 2
- the efforts devoted to marketing any other instant scratch-off 3
- 4 lottery game.

- 5 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Section and Section 8n of this Act, and (c), (d), or (e), notwithstanding 6 any other State law to the contrary, the Governor may, through 7 8 June 30, 2007, from time to time direct the State Treasurer and 9 Comptroller to transfer a specified sum from any fund held by 10 the State Treasurer to the General Revenue Fund in order to help defray the State's operating costs for the fiscal year. 11 12 The total transfer under this Section from any fund in any 13 fiscal year shall not exceed the lesser of (i) 8% of the 14 revenues to be deposited into the fund during that fiscal year 15 or (ii) an amount that leaves a remaining fund balance of 25% of the July 1 fund balance of that fiscal year. In fiscal year 16 2005 only, prior to calculating the July 1, 2004 final 17 balances, the Governor may calculate and direct the State 18 19 Treasurer with the Comptroller to transfer additional amounts determined by applying the formula authorized in Public Act 20 93-839 to the funds balances on July 1, 2003. No transfer may 21 22 be made from a fund under this Section that would have the 23 effect of reducing the available balance in the fund to an 24 amount less than the amount remaining unexpended and unreserved 25 from the total appropriation from that fund estimated to be

1 expended for that fiscal year. This Section does not apply to any funds that are restricted by federal law to a specific use, 2 to any funds in the Motor Fuel Tax Fund, the Intercity 3 4 Passenger Rail Fund, the Hospital Provider Fund, the Medicaid 5 Provider Relief Fund, the Teacher Health Insurance Security 6 Fund, the Reviewing Court Alternative Dispute Resolution Fund, the Voters' Guide Fund, the Foreign Language Interpreter Fund, 7 8 the Lawyers' Assistance Program Fund, the Supreme Court Federal Projects Fund, the Supreme Court Special State Projects Fund, 9 10 the Supplemental Low-Income Energy Assistance Fund, the Good 11 Samaritan Energy Trust Fund, the Low-Level Radioactive Waste Facility Development and Operation Fund, the Horse Racing 12 13 Equity Trust Fund, or the Hospital Basic Services Preservation 14 Fund, or to any funds to which subsection (f) of Section 20-40 15 of the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act applies. - 18 Sec. 3-664. Law Enforcement Torch Run For Special Olympics
- 19 license plates.
- (a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made in 20
- 21 the form prescribed by the Secretary of State, may issue
- 22 special registration plates designated to be Law Enforcement
- 23 Torch Run For Special Olympics license plates. The special
- plates issued under this Section shall be affixed only to 24

- passenger vehicles of the first division, motor vehicles of the 1
- second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds, and 2
- recreational vehicles as defined by Section 1-169 of this Code. 3
- 4 Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the
- 5 multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this
- 6 Code.
- (b) The design and color of the plates shall be wholly 7
- within the discretion of the Secretary of State. Appropriate 8
- 9 documentation, as determined by the Secretary, shall accompany
- 10 the application. The Secretary may, in his or her discretion,
- 11 allow the plates to be issued as vanity or personalized plates
- in accordance with Section 3-405.1 of this Code. 12
- 13 (c) An applicant shall be charged a \$45 fee for original
- 14 issuance in addition to the appropriate registration fee, if
- 15 applicable. Of this fee, \$30 shall be deposited into the
- 16 Special Olympics Illinois Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into
- the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund. For each 17
- registration renewal period, a \$27 fee, in addition to the 18
- appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this fee, 19
- 20 \$25 shall be deposited into the Special Olympics Illinois Fund
- 21 and \$2 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special
- 22 License Plate Fund.
- 23 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 24 becoming law.".
