1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 816 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 816 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section 4 14-6.10 as follows: 5 6 "(105 ILCS 5/14-6.10 new) 7 Sec. 14-6.10. Transfer of parental rights at the age of 8 majority. (a) When a student who is eliqible for special education 9 10 under this Article reaches the majority age of 18 years, all 11 rights accorded to the student's parents under this Article transfer to the student, except as provided in this Section. 12 This transfer of rights also applies to student's who are 13 incarcerated in an adult or juvenile State or local 14 correctional institution. Nothing in this Section shall be 15 construed to deny a student with a disability who has reached

1	majority age the right to have an adult of his or her choice,
2	including, but not limited to, the student's parent, assist the
3	student in making decisions regarding the student's
4	individualized education program.
5	(b) The school district must notify the student and the
6	student's parents of the transfer of rights in writing at a
7	meeting convened to review the student's individualized
8	education program during the school year in which the student
9	turns 17 years of age. The school district must also explain to
10	the student and the student's parents the significance of the
11	transfer of parental rights at the majority age of 18. At that
12	time, the school district must provide the student with a copy
13	of the Delegation of Rights form described in this Section.
14	(c) Rights shall not transfer from the parents to the
15	student under this Section if either of the following apply:
16	(1) The student with a disability who has reached the
17	age of majority has been adjudged incompetent under State
18	law.
19	(2) The student has not been adjudged incompetent under
20	State law, but the student has executed a Delegation of
21	Rights to make educational decisions pursuant to this
22	Section for the purpose of appointing the student's parent

A student may terminate the Delegation of Rights at any time and assume the right to make decisions regarding his or

her education. The Delegation of Rights shall meet all of the

2	following requirements:
3	(A) It shall remain in effect for one year after the
4	date of execution, but may be renewed annually with the
5	written or other formal authorization of the student and
6	the person the student delegates to represent the
7	educational interests of the student.
8	(B) It shall be signed by the student or verified by
9	other means, such as audio or video or other alternative
10	format compatible with the student's disability showing
11	that the student has agreed to the terms of the delegation.
12	(C) It shall be signed or otherwise manifest
13	verification that the designee accepts the delegation.
14	(D) It shall include declarations that the student (i)
15	is 18 years of age or older, (ii) intends to delegate his
16	or her educational rights under federal and State law to a
17	specified individual who is at least 18 years of age, (iii)
18	has not been adjudged incompetent under State law, (iv) is
19	entitled to be present during the development of the
20	student's individualized education program and to raise

## DELEGATION OF RIGHTS TO MAKE EDUCATIONAL DECISION

I, (insert name), am 18 years of age or older and a student who has the right to make educational decisions for myself under State and federal law. I have not been adjudged incompetent and, as of the date of the execution of this document, I hereby delegate my right to give consent and make decisions concerning my education to (insert name), who will be considered my "parent" for purposes of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act of 2004 and Article 14 of the School Code and will exercise all of the rights and responsibilities concerning my education that are conferred on a parent under those laws. I understand and give my consent for (insert name) to make all decisions relating to my education on my behalf. I understand that I have the right to be present at meetings held to develop my individualized education program and that I have the right to raise any issues or concerns I may have and that the school district must consider them. This delegation will be in effect for one year from the date of execution below and may be renewed by my written or other formal authorization. I also understand that I have the right to terminate this Delegation of Rights at any time and assume the right to make my own decisions regarding my
