SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

60 ILCS 1/14a new 65 ILCS 5/11-6-5 new 70 ILCS 705/25 new

Amends the Township Code, the Municipal Code, and the Fire Protection District Act. Provides that townships, municipalities, and fire protection districts may fix, charge, and collect reasonable fees from certain parties for providing specialized rescue services. Defines "specialized rescue services".

1 AN ACT concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Township Code is amended by adding Section 14a as follows:
- 6 (60 ILCS 1/14a new)
- 7 Sec. 14a. Reimbursement for specialized rescue services. A township that provides fire protection services may fix, 8 9 charge, and collect reasonable fees for specialized rescue services provided by the township. The total amount collected 10 may not exceed the reasonable cost of providing those 11 12 specialized rescue services and may include an hourly rate per vehicle, an hourly rate per firefighter, and the cost of 13 14 materials. The fee may be charged to the following parties:
- 15 <u>(a) the owner of the property on which the specialized</u>
 16 rescue services occurred;
- (b) any person involved in an activity that caused or contributed to the emergency;
- (c) an individual who is rescued during the emergency
 and his or her employer if the person was acting in
 furtherance of the employer's interests;
- 22 <u>(d) in cases involving the recovery of property, any</u>
 23 person having control or custody of the property at the

- 10 Sec. 11-6-5. Reimbursement for specialized rescue
- 11 services. The corporate authorities of a municipality that
- 12 operates a fire department may fix, charge, and collect
- reasonable fees for specialized rescue services provided by the
- department. The total amount collected may not exceed the
- reasonable cost of providing those specialized rescue services
- and may include an hourly rate per vehicle, an hourly rate per
- 17 firefighter, and the cost of materials. The fees may be charged
- 18 to the following parties:
- 19 (a) the owner of the property on which the specialized
- 20 rescue services occurred;
- (b) any person involved in an activity that caused or

The total amount collected may not exceed the reasonable cost of providing those specialized rescue services and may include an hourly rate per vehicle, an hourly rate per firefighter, and the cost of materials. The fees may be charged to the following parties:
