

95TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2007 and 2008 HB1485

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/21-29 new 110 ILCS 205/9.33 new

Amends the School Code. Provides that a transition specialist certificate shall be issued to persons who, through their education and training, have a comprehensive understanding of the requirements for transition planning and of transition services for students with all types of disabilities and are aware of the array of options available to students with disabilities after they exit high school. Provides that before the 2008-2009 academic year, the Board of Higher Education shall, in collaboration with the Interagency Coordinating Council and the Advisory Council on the Education of Children with Disabilities, develop coursework for students who want to qualify for a transition specialist certificate. Provides that those public universities that are teacher training institutions shall implement the coursework developed by the Board beginning with the 2008-2009 academic year. Effective immediately.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 5 21-29 as follows:

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- 6 (105 ILCS 5/21-29 new)
- Sec. 21-29. Transition specialist certificate. A

 transition specialist certificate shall be issued to those

 applicants who meet all of the following qualifications:
- 10 (1) The person is of good character and good health and

 11 is a citizen of the United States and at least 19 years of

 12 age.
 - (2) The person, through his or her education and training as determined by the State Superintendent of Education in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board, (i) has a comprehensive understanding of the requirements for transition planning and of transition services for students with all types of disabilities and (ii) is aware of the array of options available to students with disabilities after they exit high school, including employment and training, post-secondary education, vocational education, independent living, leisure skills training, and

2	(3) The person meets all other requirements
3	established by the State Superintendent of Education in
4	consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board so
5	that a person who holds a transition specialist certificate
6	is qualified to perform all of the following functions:
7	(A) Provide leadership and expertise to
8	individualized education program team members and
9	other school personnel as they develop and implement
10	transition plans for students with disabilities.
11	(B) Monitor the implementation of transition
12	services to students with disabilities.
13	(C) Recommend modifications to transition plans
14	and services for students with disabilities as deemed
15	necessary.
16	(D) Ensure that parents and quardians of students
17	with disabilities have the opportunity to fully
18	participate in and understand the transition planning
19	process and the provision of transition services for
20	their child.
21	(E) Be primarily responsible for the development
22	of additional transition resources and services for
23	students with disabilities in the communities served
