Appropriates a total of \$5,500,000 to the Department of Public Health, the Department of Human Services, the Department on Aging, the Department of Children and Family Services, and the Illinois State Board of Education for various activities in relation to suicide prevention. Effective July 1, 2007.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 10. The sum of \$250,000, or so much of that 3 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General 4 Revenue Fund to the Department of Human Services to develop 5 6 and enhance the capacity of health service providers statewide to increase suicide prevention and 7 earlv intervention skills through local education by experts in the 8 field. 9

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11 Section 15. The sum of \$250,000, or so much of that 12 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General 13 Revenue Fund to the Department on Aging to develop and 14 enhance the capacity of service providers to the aging 15 population in Illinois on suicide prevention and early 16 intervention skills.

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18 Section 20. The sum of \$250,000, or so much of that 19 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General 20 Revenue Fund to the Department of Children and Family 21 Services to develop and enhance service provider skills to 22 traumatized children in the child welfare system on suicide 23 prevention and early intervention.

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25 Section 25. The following amounts, or so much of those

2	General Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education
3	to support and build the following school-based initiatives:
4	(1) For professional development related to suicide
5	prevention, and mental and emotional
6	disorders\$250,000
7	(2) For grants to school districts to develop and
8	implement suicide prevention initiatives within
9	their curricula, increase in-school mental health
10	support, conduct staff development, and educate
11	students and parents or other
12	caregivers\$850,000

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,2007.
