AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Identification Card Act is amended
 by changing Sections 4 and 9 as follows:
- 6 (15 ILCS 335/4) (from Ch. 124, par. 24)
- 7

Sec. 4. Identification Card.

(a) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard Illinois 8 9 Identification Card to any natural person who is a resident of the State of Illinois who applies for such card, or renewal 10 thereof, or who applies for a standard Illinois Identification 11 12 Card upon release as a committed person on parole, mandatory 13 supervised release, final discharge, or pardon from the 14 Department of Corrections by submitting an identification card issued by the Department of Corrections under Section 3-14-1 of 15 the Unified Code of Corrections, together with the prescribed 16 17 fees. No identification card shall be issued to any person who holds a valid foreign state identification card, license, or 18 19 permit unless the person first surrenders to the Secretary of 20 State the valid foreign state identification card, license, or 21 permit. The card shall be prepared and supplied by the 22 Secretary of State and shall include a photograph of the applicant. The applicant, upon receipt of a card and prior to 23

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its use for any purpose, shall affix his signature thereon in 1 2 the space provided therefor. The Illinois Identification Card 3 may be used for identification purposes in any lawful situation only by the person to whom it was issued. As used in this Act, 4 5 "photograph" means any color photograph or digitally produced and captured image of an applicant for an identification card. 6 7 As used in this Act, "signature" means the name of a person as 8 written by that person and captured in a manner acceptable to 9 the Secretary of State.

10 (b) The Secretary of State shall issue a special Illinois 11 Identification Card, which shall be known as an Illinois 12 Disabled Person Identification Card, to any natural person who is a resident of the State of Illinois, who is a disabled 13 14 person as defined in Section 4A of this Act, who applies for renewal thereof. 15 such card, or No Disabled Person 16 Identification Card shall be issued to any person who holds a 17 valid foreign state identification card, license, or permit unless the person first surrenders to the Secretary of State 18 19 the valid foreign state identification card, license, or 20 permit. The Secretary of State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be prepared and supplied by the 21 22 Secretary of State, and shall include a photograph of the 23 applicant, a designation indicating that the card is an 24 Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card, and shall 25 include a comprehensible designation of the type and 26 classification of the applicant's disability as set out in HB4165 Enrolled - 3 - LRB095 14303 DRH 40186 b

Section 4A of this Act. If the applicant so requests, the card 1 2 shall include a description of the applicant's disability and 3 any information about the applicant's disability or medical history which the Secretary determines would be helpful to the 4 5 applicant in securing emergency medical care. The applicant, 6 upon receipt of such a card and prior to its use for any 7 purpose, shall have affixed thereon in the space provided 8 therefor his signature or mark. If a mark is used in lieu of a 9 signature, such mark shall be affixed to the card in the 10 presence of two witnesses who attest to the authenticity of the 11 mark. The Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card may be 12 used for identification purposes in any lawful situation by the 13 person to whom it was issued.

The Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card may be 14 15 used as adequate documentation of disability in lieu of a 16 physician's determination of disability, a determination of 17 disability from a physician assistant who has been delegated the authority to make this determination by his or her 18 supervising physician, a determination of disability from an 19 advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative 20 agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the 21 22 advanced practice nurse to make this determination, or any 23 other documentation of disability whenever any State law 24 requires that a disabled person provide such documentation of 25 disability, however an Illinois Disabled Person Identification 26 Card shall not qualify the cardholder to participate in any

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program or to receive any benefit which is not available to all 1 2 persons with like disabilities. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, an Illinois Disabled Person Identification 3 Card, or evidence that the Secretary of State has issued an 4 5 Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card, shall not be used 6 by any person other than the person named on such card to prove that the person named on such card is a disabled person or for 7 any other purpose unless the card is used for the benefit of 8 9 the person named on such card, and the person named on such 10 card consents to such use at the time the card is so used.

11 When medical information is contained on an Illinois 12 Disabled Person Identification Card, the Office of the 13 Secretary of State shall not be liable for any actions taken 14 based upon that medical information.

15 (c) Beginning January 1, 1986, the Secretary of State shall 16 provide that each original or renewal Illinois Identification 17 Card or Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card issued to a person under the age of 21, shall be of a distinct nature 18 from those Illinois Identification Cards or Illinois Disabled 19 Person Identification Cards issued to individuals 21 years of 20 age or older. The color designated for Illinois Identification 21 22 Cards or Illinois Disabled Person Identification Cards for 23 persons under the age of 21 shall be at the discretion of the 24 Secretary of State.

(c-1) Beginning January 1, 2003, each original or renewal
 Illinois Identification Card or Illinois Disabled Person

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Identification Card issued to a person under the age of 21 shall display the date upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon which the person becomes 21 years of age.

5 (d) The Secretary of State may issue a Senior Citizen 6 discount card, to any natural person who is a resident of the 7 State of Illinois who is 60 years of age or older and who 8 applies for such a card or renewal thereof. The Secretary of 9 State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be 10 issued in every county and applications shall be made available 11 at, but not limited to, nutrition sites, senior citizen centers 12 and Area Agencies on Aging. The applicant, upon receipt of such card and prior to its use for any purpose, shall have affixed 13 14 thereon in the space provided therefor his signature or mark.

(e) The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may 15 designate on each Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 16 17 Disabled Person Identification Card a space where the card holder may place a sticker or decal, issued by the Secretary of 18 19 State, of uniform size as the Secretary may specify, that shall 20 indicate in appropriate language that the card holder has 21 renewed his or her Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 22 Disabled Person Identification Card.

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1 Sec. 9. Renewal.

(a) Any person having a valid identification card which
expires on his or her 21st birthday, or which expires 3 months
after his or her 21st birthday, may not apply for renewal of
his or her existing identification card. A subsequent
application filed by persons under this subsection, on or after
their 21st birthday, shall be considered an application for a
new card under Section 5 of this Act.

9 (b) Any person having a valid identification card, except 10 those under subsection (a), may apply for a one-time renewal, 11 in a manner prescribed by the Secretary of State, within 30 12 days after the expiration of the identification card. A subsequent application filed by that person shall be considered 13 an application for a new card under Section 5 of this Act. Any 14 identification card renewed under this subsection shall be 15 16 valid for 5 years after the expiration date of the 17 identification card as originally issued under Section 5 of this Act. The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may 18 19 provide that applications for the one-time renewal under this 20 subsection (b) may be made by telephone, mail, or the Internet, 21 subject to any eligibility criteria and other requirements that 22 the Secretary of State deems appropriate.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act to the
 contrary, a person convicted of a sex offense as defined in
 Section 2 of the Sex Offender Registration Act may not renew
 his or her Illinois Identification Card or Illinois Disabled

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Person Identification Card by telephone, mail, or the Internet.
