1 AN ACT concerning children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act is amended by adding Section 4.5 as follows:
- 6 (325 ILCS 5/4.5 new)
- 7 Sec. 4.5. Electronic and information technology workers;
- 8 reporting child pornography.
- 9 <u>(a) In this Section:</u>
- 10 <u>"Child pornography" means child pornography as described</u>
- in Section 11-20.1 of the Criminal Code of 1961 or aggravated
- child pornography as described in Section 11-20.3 of the
- 13 Criminal Code of 1961.
- 14 <u>"Electronic and information technology equipment" means</u>
- 15 <u>equipment used in the creation, manipulation, storage,</u>
- 16 <u>display</u>, or transmission of data, including internet and
- intranet systems, software applications, operating systems,
- 18 <u>video and multimedia, telecommunications products, kiosks,</u>
- 19 <u>information transaction machines</u>, copiers, printers, and
- desktop and portable computers.
- "Electronic and information technology equipment worker"
- 22 means a person who in the scope and course of his or her
- 23 employment or business installs, repairs, or otherwise

- 1 services electronic and information technology equipment for a 2 fee but does not include (i) an employee, independent
- 3 contractor, or other agent of a telecommunications carrier or
- telephone or telecommunications cooperative, as those terms 4
- 5 are defined in the Public Utilities Act, or (ii) an employee,
- independent contractor, or other agent of a provider of 6
- 7 commercial mobile radio service, as defined in 47 C.F.R. 20.3.
- 8 (b) If an electronic and information technology equipment
- 9 worker discovers any depiction of child pornography while
- installing, repairing, or otherwise servicing an item of 10
- 11 electronic and information technology equipment, that worker
- 12 or the worker's employer shall immediately report the discovery
- to the local law enforcement agency or to the Cyber Tipline at 13
- 14 the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children.
- (c) If a report is filed in accordance with the 15
- requirements of 42 U.S.C. 13032, the requirements of this 16
- Section 4.5 will be deemed to have been met. 17
- (d) An electronic and information technology equipment 18
- 19 worker or electronic and information technology equipment
- 20 worker's employer who reports a discovery of child pornography
- as required under this <u>Section is immune from any criminal</u>, 21
- 22 civil, or administrative liability in connection with making
- 23 the report, except for willful or wanton misconduct.
- 24 (e) Failure to report a discovery of child pornography as
- 25 required under this Section is a business offense subject to a
- fine of \$1,001. 26
