1 AN ACT concerning education.

## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
2-3.71 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.71) (from Ch. 122, par. 2-3.71)

7 Sec. 2-3.71. Grants for preschool educational programs.

8 (a) Preschool program.

9 (1) The State Board of Education shall implement and administer a grant program under the provisions of this 10 subsection which shall consist of grants to public school 11 districts and other eligible entities, as defined by the 12 State Board of Education, to conduct voluntary preschool 13 14 educational programs for children ages 3 to 5 which include a parent education component. A public school district 15 16 which receives grants under this subsection mav 17 subcontract with other entities that are eligible to conduct a preschool educational program. These grants must 18 19 be used to supplement, not supplant, funds received from 20 any other source.

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- (2) (Blank).

(3) Any teacher of preschool children in the programauthorized by this subsection shall hold an early childhood

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teaching certificate.

2 (4) This paragraph (4) applies before July 1, 2006 and after June 30, 2010 2008. The State Board of Education 3 shall provide the primary source of funding through 4 5 appropriations for the program. Such funds shall be distributed for the benefit of children who because of 6 their home and community environment are subject to such 7 8 language, cultural, economic and like disadvantages that 9 they have been determined as a result of screening 10 procedures to be at risk of academic failure. Such 11 screening procedures shall be based criteria on 12 established by the State Board of Education.

13 (4.5) This paragraph (4.5) applies from July 1, 2006 14 through June 30, 2010 <del>2008</del>. The State Board of Education 15 shall provide the primary source of funding through 16 appropriations for the program. Such funds shall be 17 distributed to achieve a goal of "Preschool for All Children" for the benefit of all children whose families 18 19 choose to participate in the program. Based on available 20 appropriations, newly funded programs shall be selected 21 through a process giving first priority to qualified 22 programs serving primarily at-risk children and second 23 priority to qualified programs serving primarily children with a family income of less than 4 times the poverty 24 25 guidelines updated periodically in the Federal Register by 26 the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services under the

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authority of 42 U.S.C. 9902(2). For purposes of this 1 2 paragraph (4.5), at-risk children are those who because of 3 their home and community environment are subject to such language, cultural, economic and like disadvantages to 4 5 cause them to have been determined as a result of screening procedures to be at risk of academic failure. 6 Such 7 procedures shall be based on criteria screening 8 established by the State Board of Education.

9 On or before November 1 of each fiscal year in which 10 the General Assembly provides funding for new programs 11 under this paragraph (4.5), the State Board of Education 12 shall report to the General Assembly on what percentage of 13 new funding was provided to programs serving primarily 14 at-risk children, what percentage of new funding was 15 provided to programs serving primarily children with a 16 family income of less than 4 times the federal poverty 17 level, and what percentage of new funding was provided to 18 other programs.

19 The State Board of Education shall develop and (5) 20 provide evaluation tools, including tests, that school districts and other eligible entities may use to evaluate 21 22 children for school readiness prior to age 5. The State 23 Board of Education shall require school districts and other eligible entities to obtain consent from the parents or 24 25 children before any evaluations quardians of are 26 conducted. local school districts and other eligible entities to evaluate the population of preschool children in their communities and provide preschool programs, pursuant to this subsection, where appropriate.

5 (6) The State Board of Education shall report to the General Assembly by November 1, 2010 July 1, 2007 and every 6 7 3 years thereafter on the results and progress of students 8 were enrolled in preschool educational programs, who 9 including an assessment of which programs have been most 10 successful in promoting academic excellence and 11 alleviating academic failure. The State Board of Education 12 shall assess the academic progress of all students who have 13 been enrolled in preschool educational programs.

14 On or before November 1 of each fiscal year in which 15 the General Assembly provides funding for new programs 16 under paragraph (4.5) of this Section, the State Board of 17 Education shall report to the General Assembly on what 18 percentage of new funding was provided to programs serving 19 primarily at-risk children, what percentage of new funding was provided to programs serving primarily children with a 20 21 family income of less than 4 times the federal poverty 22 level, and what percentage of new funding was provided to 23 other programs.
