A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
7 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated from the
8 General Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education to meet
9 ordinary and contingent expenses for the fiscal year ending
10 June 30, 2009:

11	For Personal Services	2,100,100
12	For State Contributions to Social	
13	Security, for Medicare	28,000
14	For Contractual Services	568,500
15	For Travel	60,000
16	For Commodities	11,800
17	For Printing	10,900
18	For Equipment	16,500
19	For Telecommunications	36,300
20	For Operation of Automotive Equipment	<u>3,200</u>
21	Total	\$2,835,300

1 Section 10. The following named amount, or so much
 2 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
 3 Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education for
 4 distribution as grants authorized by the Higher Education
 5 Cooperation Act:

6 Quad-Cities Graduate Study Center220,000

7 Section 15. The following named amount, or so much
 8 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
 9 Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education for
 10 distribution as grants authorized by the Higher Education
 11 Cooperation Act:

12 Access and Diversity3,787,300

13 Section 20. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 14 as may be necessary, are appropriated from the General
 15 Revenue Fund to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for
 16 Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (S.T.E.M.)
 17 diversity initiatives to enhance S.T.E.M. programs for
 18 students from underrepresented groups:

19 Chicago Area Health and Medical
 20 Careers Program (C.A.H.M.C.P.)900,000
 21 Illinois Mathematics and Science
 22 Academy Excellence 2000 Program
 23 in Mathematics and Science100,000

1 Section 50. The sum of \$2,100,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
3 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for distribution as
4 grants for Cooperative Work Study Programs to institutions of
5 higher education.

6 Section 55. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for competitive grants
9 for nursing schools to increase the number of graduating
10 nurses.

11 Section 60. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for nurse educator
14 fellowships to supplement nurse faculty salaries.

15 Section 70. The sum of \$140,700, or so much thereof may
16 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
17 to the Board of Higher Education for costs and expenses
18 related to or in support of a higher education shared
19 services center.

20 Section 75. The sum of \$300,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 2 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for the International
 3 Center on Deafness and the Arts (ICODA) Program.

4 Section 80. The following named amounts, or so much
 5 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
 6 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated from the
 7 General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Mathematics and Science
 8 Academy to meet ordinary and contingent expenses for the
 9 fiscal year ending June 30, 2009:

21 Section 85. The following named amounts, or so much
 22 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
 23 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated from the

1 Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy Income Fund to the
2 Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy to meet ordinary and
3 contingent expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009:

4	For Personal Services	1,598,000
5	For State Contributions to Social	
6	Security, for Medicare	27,400
7	For Contractual Services	981,100
8	For Travel	126,700
9	For Commodities	143,200
10	For Equipment	65,000
11	For Telecommunications	80,000

15 Section 90. The sum of \$450,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
17 Fund to the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy for the
18 Excellence 2000 Program in Mathematics and Science.

19 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
20 1, 2008.
