

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 10. The following amounts or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State
7 Board of Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and
8 not, under any circumstances, for personal services
9 expenditures or other operational or administrative costs,
10 are appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for
11 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008:

19 Section 70. The amount of \$8,484,800, or so much of that
20 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State
21 Board of Education Special Purpose Trust Fund to the State
22 Board of Education for expenditures by the Board in
23 accordance with grants, gifts or donations that the Board has
24 received or may receive from any source, public or private,

1 in support of projects that are within the lawful powers of
2 the Board.

3 Section 75. The amount of \$7,015,200, or so much of that
4 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State
5 Board of Education Special Purpose Trust Fund to the State
6 Board of Education for its ordinary and contingent expenses.

7 Section 80. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
9 Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all costs
10 associated with implementation of the State Board of
11 Education Strategic Plan.

12 Section 100. The amount of \$29,982,000, or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
14 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for
15 Student Assessments, including Bilingual Assessments.

16 Section 105. The amount of \$23,780,300, or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State
18 Board of Education Federal Department of Education Fund to
19 the Illinois State Board of Education for Student
20 Assessments.

1 Section 110. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
3 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
4 costs associated with Growth Models.

5 Section 120. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
7 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
8 costs associated with the Response to Intervention
9 Initiative.

10 Section 125. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much
11 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
12 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
13 costs with associated Targeted Interventions.

14 Section 130. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much
15 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
16 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
17 costs associated with the Technology Immersion Pilot Program.

18 Section 135. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
20 Fund for deposit into the Temporary Relocation Assistance
21 Revolving Grant Fund.

1 Section 140. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
3 Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for Adler
4 Planetarium.

5 Section 145. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
7 Fund to the State Board of Education for grants to
8 agriculture science teacher education programs in accordance
9 with Public Act 95-153.

10 Section 150. The amount of \$150,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Civic Education
12 Trust Fund to the State Board of Education for grants to
13 public high schools that have completed and submitted a Civic
14 Audit in accordance with Public Act 95-225.

15 Section 155. The amount of \$21,000,000, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for fiscal year
17 2009 from the General Revenue Fund to the State Board of
18 Education to be used by the State Board of Education
19 exclusively for school districts that will receive less
20 funding in the 2008-2009 school year than they received in
21 the 2006-2007 school year as a result of Public Act 93-1022.

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ARTICLE 998

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Section 998. Each of the amounts appropriated in this

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Act (after all actions by the Governor and the General

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Assembly) controls over any lower amount appropriated in any

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other Public Act (after all actions by the Governor and the

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General Assembly) for the same purpose unless that other

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Public Act expressly states otherwise.

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ARTICLE 999

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Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July

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1, 2008.
