1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6415

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6415, by deleting
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
4 thereof the following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 5. The sum of \$4,112,300, new appropriation, is
7 appropriated, and the sum of \$17,114,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2008, from appropriations heretofore
10 made in Article 250, Section 5 of Public Act 95-348, are
11 reappropriated from the Partners for Conservation Fund to the
12 Department of Natural Resources for the Partners for
13 Conservation Program to implement ecosystem-based management
14 for Illinois' natural resources.

1 Section 10. The sum of \$2,201,100, new appropriation, is
 2 appropriated from the Partners for Conservation Fund to the
 3 Department of Natural Resources for expenses of the Partners
 4 for Conservation Program.

5 Section 15. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 6 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and
 7 purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the
 8 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Department of Natural
 9 Resources:

10 OFFICE OF RESOURCE CONSERVATION

11 For an Urban Fishing Program in
 12 conjunction with the Chicago Park
 13 District to provide fishing and

12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit into the
14 State Cooperative Extension Service Trust Fund for
15 operational expenses and programs at the University of
16 Illinois Cook County Cooperative Extension Service.

 2 General Revenue Disaster Relief appropriation in order to
 3 provide such services or to reimburse local governmental

22 made for such purpose in Article 235, Sections 20 and 25 of
23 Public Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Illinois

1 Historic Sites Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for
 2 awards and grants for historic preservation programs made
 3 either independently or in cooperation with the Federal
 4 Government or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation,
 5 or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 6 private corporation, organization, or individual.

7 Section 25. The following named amounts, or so much
 8 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated
 9 for the objects and purposes hereinafter named, to meet the
 10 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Historic Preservation

Section 998. Each of the amounts appropriated in this

Act (after all actions by the Governor and the General

Assembly) controls over any lower amount appropriated in any

other Public Act (after all actions by the Governor and the

General Assembly) for the same purpose unless that other

Public Act expressly states otherwise.

Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect

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July 1, 2008."
