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1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6526

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6526, by deleting
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
4 thereof the following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 10. The following named amounts, or so much
7 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated
8 to the Department of Healthcare and Family Services for
9 Medical Assistance for persons meeting the eligibility
10 requirements set forth in the Medicaid State Plan or the
11 Title XXI plan at any time; or the Illinois statues and the
12 Illinois Administrative Code as of October, 31, 2007. Any
13 payment for a person not meeting these eligibility
14 requirements must be the result of an order from an agency of

1 the United States Government or any court with jurisdiction
2 over eligibility issues. Payments for operations related to
3 the eligible populations are permitted where applicable in
4 this section:

7 Juvenile Rehabilitation Services Medicaid Matching Fund for
8 grants to the Department of Juvenile Justice and counties for
9 court-ordered juvenile behavioral health services under the
10 Medicaid Rehabilitation Option and the Children's Health
11 Insurance Program Act.

12 Section 120. The amount of \$9,787,700, or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the
14 Department of Healthcare and Family Services from the Medical
15 Special Purposes Trust Fund for medical demonstration
16 projects and costs associated with the implementation of
17 federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act
18 mandates.

19 Section 130. The amount of \$200,000,000, or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the
21 Department of Healthcare and Family Services from the Special
22 Education Medicaid Matching Fund for grants to local

1 education agencies for medical services and other costs
2 eligible for federal reimbursement under Title XIX or Title
3 XXI of the federal Social Security Act.

4 Section 140. The amount of \$34,100,000, or so much
5 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the
6 Department of Healthcare and Family Services from the General
7 Revenue Fund for contractual obligations associated with the
8 Disease Management Contract.

9 Section 150. The amount of \$27,500,000, or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the
11 Department of Healthcare and Family Services from the General
12 Revenue Fund for contractual obligations associated with the
13 Primary Care Case Management Contract.

14 Section 160. The following named amounts, or so much
