SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends "An Act concerning appropriations", Public Act 95-731, and "An Act concerning appropriations", Public Act 95-734. Reduces or eliminates certain appropriations to certain State agencies. Partially restores certain appropriations to the Department of Human Services that were reduced or vetoed by the Governor. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. "An Act concerning appropriations", Public Act
5 95-731, approved with items vetoed and reduced on July 9,
6 2008, is amended by changing Section 30 of Article 1 as
7 follows:

9 Sec. 30. The sum of \$2,860,000 ~~\$5,360,000~~, or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
11 Revenue Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit
12 into the State Cooperative Extension Service Trust Fund for
13 operational expenses and programs at the University of
14 Illinois Cook County Cooperative Extension Service.
