1 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

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WHEREAS, Several recent economic and academic studies have demonstrated a growing skills gap among workers in the nation; and

5 WHEREAS, These studies have demonstrated that the greatest 6 disparity in skills exists among the nation's traditionally 7 underrepresented minority populations, specifically African 8 Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans; and

9 WHEREAS, A logical and efficient manner of addressing this 10 skill gap is through the provision of post-secondary education; 11 and

WHEREAS, Illinois needs to improve college access for all of its citizens in order to address the skill gap, provide a cadre of more qualified and competent workers for Illinois businesses, and improve the State economy; and

WHEREAS, Traditionally underrepresented populations, specifically African Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans, make up an increasingly higher percentage of the State's population, and thus will be called upon to make up an increasingly higher percentage of the State's workforce; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Traditionally underrepresented populations, 2 specifically African Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans, 3 make up a disproportionately lower percentage of those students 4 attending colleges and universities in Illinois as compared to 5 their overall Illinois population; and
- WHEREAS, It has been demonstrated that traditionally underrepresented student populations are more successful in their degree attainment when they are taught and supported by faculty and staff that includes those of similar ethnic and
- 10 cultural backgrounds; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Traditionally underrepresented populations, 12 specifically African Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans, 13 make up a disproportionately lower percentage of the faculty 14 and staff at colleges and universities in Illinois as compared 15 to their overall Illinois population; therefore, be it
- 16 RESOLVED, ΒY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THE 17 NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that a bi-partisan task force on the 18 19 status of underrepresented minorities in higher education is 20 commissioned to evaluate the status of traditionally underrepresented populations, specifically African Americans, 21 Latinos, and Native Americans, in this State's public and 22 23 private institutions of higher education; and be it further

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- 1 RESOLVED, That membership on this task force include 2
- 2 Republican and 2 Democrat members of the House of
- Representatives, 2 Republican and 2 Democrat members of the
- 4 Senate, and the directors or their designees of the following
- 5 organizations: the State Board of Education, the Board of
- 6 Higher Education, the Illinois Student Assistance Commission,
- 7 the Federation of Independent Illinois Colleges and
- 8 Universities, the Illinois Committee on Black Concerns in
- 9 Higher Education, and the Illinois Latino Council on Higher
- 10 Education; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That this task force assess accessibility of
- 12 institutions of higher education in Illinois for those in the
- 13 above-stated Illinois populations who want to enroll as
- 14 students; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That the task force assess the representation of
- these populations in all job categories, including faculty,
- 17 staff, and civil service, at institutions of higher education
- in Illinois; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the task force assess issues of campus
- 20 climate that might affect the success of students and the
- 21 retention of faculty and staff at institutions of higher
- 22 education in Illinois; and be it further

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1 RESOLVED, That the task force pay particular attention 2 during its assessment of those college and university programs 3 that target areas of the most drastic skills disparity, as 4 identified by previously published economic and academic 5 studies; and be it further

RESOLVED, That in order to make these assessments, the task
force hold a series of regional public hearings on college and
university campuses across the State; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this task force shall file a report with the General Assembly, the Office of the Governor, the State Board of Education, and the Board of Higher Education upon completion of its assessments, and that this report shall include any findings and recommendations for further legislative action that are generated as a result of the task force's work; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the directors of the State Board of Education, the Board of Higher Education, the Illinois Student Assistance Commission, the Federation of Independent Illinois Colleges and Universities, the Illinois Committee on Black Concerns in Higher Education, and the Illinois Latino Council on Higher Education.
