1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control has reported that one in 150 children born today will be diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder; and

- 5 WHEREAS, The Illinois State Board of Education has reported 6 that today there are more than twice as many children in 7 Illinois diagnosed with autism as there were only five years 8 ago; and
- 9 WHEREAS, It is estimated that only one of every ten 10 children with autism receives the level and type of services 11 recommended by the National Research Council in 2001; and
- WHEREAS, Families of children with autism bear an enormous financial burden of providing needed services and healthcare; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Not-for-profit entities such as the Autism
 16 Society of Illinois, Autism Speaks, and Giant Steps Illinois
 17 promote through advocacy, public awareness, education, and
 18 research, lifelong access and opportunities for persons within
 19 the autism spectrum disorder and their families in order that
 20 they may be fully included, participating members of their
 21 communities; and

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WHEREAS, Public entities such as the Illinois Autism Training and Technical Assistance Project and private entities like Giant Steps of Illinois provide educational therapeutic services to enable children with autism to achieve their maximum potential and strive to improve a child's ability to interact, communicate, and develop academic and daily life skills; these groups work cooperatively with local school districts to reintegrate students with autism into their home school on a full-time or part-time basis based on the individual needs of the student; therefore, be it

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES RESOLVED, ΒY THENINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we name the month of April 2008 as Autism Awareness Month in the State of Illinois, and we recognize and commend the parents and caregivers of children and adults with autism for their sacrifice and dedication in providing for the special needs of children with autism and for absorbing significant financial costs for specialized education and support services; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support the following goals: increasing State and federal funding for home and community based services; Medicaid waiver programs that families can direct so that their loved ones with autism can receive appropriate

1 intervention, treatment, support; expanding and 2 supports and services for individuals with autism across their life span so that they may have choices and individualized 3 supports, services, and living arrangements; promoting the use 5 of best practices in public schools; promoting understanding 6 and acceptance of the special needs of people with autism and 7 their families; promoting the full inclusion of persons with autism in our communities; and increasing federal and private 8 9 funding for research to learn the root causes of autism and to 10 explore potential biomedical treatments for autism; and be it 11 further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Autism Society of Illinois, Autism Speaks Illinois, the Illinois Autism Training and Technical Assistance Project, and Giant Steps of Illinois.
