2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of 3 Representatives are pleased to congratulate the Jefferson 4 County recipients of the 2008 Senior Saints Hall of Fame Honors 5 on the occasion of their accomplishments; and

WHEREAS, Ernest Collins is a veteran of the U.S. Air Force, a former Illinois State Trooper, and a volunteer fire fighter; he has donated much of his time and effort to volunteering for various civic organizations; he has assisted in coaching sports while his sons were growing up and has continued with his oldest grandson; he has served as a player coach on the church league softball team; he teaches the effects of alcohol while driving to teenagers in Jefferson, Hamilton, and Franklin Counties and teaches programs on the American flag; he is a board member of the Epilepsy Foundation, Hickory Shadow Zoo, and the Smith Cemetery Association; he is a member of the Senior Advisory Council, delivers Meals on Wheels, serves as a deacon at Meadowbrook Christian Church, and serves as president of the local chapter for the Experimental Aircraft Association; he is a member of the American Legion's Honor Guard and is an Honor Guard Chaplain on the Operation Iraqi Freedom committee; he is also a Cadet Commander for the Civil Air Patrol and is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Moose, and Amvets; and

WHEREAS, Lt. Colonel R.D. White volunteered for the military of July of 1942, where was deployed in the Pacific theatre; he later served during the Korean War and in the Vietnam War until his retirement in 1970; he has served his community as a deacon of his church and in assisting in the building of the church's new building, he was instrumental in organizing the local EAA chapter and in promoting the Young Eagle Program to help youths in his community; and

WHEREAS, Ronald and Phyllis Adcock were married on July 14, 1956; are well known in their community for their charitable works; Ronald is a former employee of the Mt. Vernon Public Works Department and the Mt. Vernon Fire Department and currently keeps busy with several different positions; Phyllis is a former employee of the Livingston Drug Store and the E.F. Wielt Company; she serves as the Chairman of the Mother March of Dimes; she and her husband are members of the Red Cross Disaster Team, are regular blood donors, donate care packages to soldiers, deliver Christmas baskets to the needy, and are certified Lane Inspectors, coaches and instructors; Ronald and Phyllis are also accomplished bowlers and have both received many awards and accolades for their bowling prowess; and

WHEREAS, Harold and Barbara Lemons were married on February 16, 1957 in Mt. Vernon; Harold is a U.S. Army veteran, having

WHEREAS, Betty Hayes was employed with the Jefferson County

ASCS for thirty years, working with farmers, measuring farm land, and helping them grow their crops; after retiring, she still wanted to help others, so she decided to help working mothers with watching their children; she is an active member of her church, where she currently serves as chairperson of the church council board, President of Wesley United Methodist, Representative for education, worship, stewardship, and Cluster Representative; she helps with the Lenton Service during Lent, walks for Crop Walk, Ice Cream Socials, and is head of the kitchen during funeral dinners, among many other volunteer duties; she is the recipient of the Mother of the Years Award in 1985 and the Do Award in 2005 in recognition of her many accomplishments; she and her husband, Bob, have been married for 66 years; and

WHEREAS, Bennie Melton went into the Marine Corps as a gunner and torpedoed Bombay in the South Pacific; he came home in 1946 as a 32nd Degree Mason and worked in the oil fields; he later helped build trucks and became a civil engineer; in 1958, Bennie worked for a truck line and worked for almost every oil company in the U.S.; he retired in 1985 and bought the Beasley Motel Rest and Lounge, which he sold on contract in 1995; he is an antique car collector and a respected member of Old Timer Car Club of Mt. Vernon; he is a member of the Shriners, V.F.W., and is a former member of Amvets and American Legion; he has always tried to help others and has driven Senior Saints in the
