1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 133 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend Senate Bill 133, AS AMENDED, by 3 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the 4 following: "Section 5. The Mercury-Free Vaccine Act is amended by 5 6 changing Sections 5 and 10 as follows: 7 (410 ILCS 51/5) Sec. 5. Banned mercury-containing vaccines. 8 (a) Except for an influenza vaccine, on or after January 1, 9 10 2008, a person who is knowingly pregnant or who is under 3 11 years of age shall not be vaccinated with a mercury-containing vaccine or injected with a mercury-containing product that 12 contains more than 0.5 micrograms of mercury per 0.5 milliliter 13 dose. Commencing January 1, 2006, a person shall not be 14 15 vaccinated with a mercury containing vaccine that contains

more than 1.25 micrograms of mercury per dose.

(b) On and after January 1, 2008, a person who is knowingly 1 pregnant or who is under 3 years of age shall not be vaccinated 2 with a mercury-containing influenza vaccine that contains more 3 4 than 1.0 microgram of mercury per 0.5 milliliter dose. 5 Commencing January 1, 2008, no person shall be vaccinated with 6 a vaccine or injected with any product that contains, or prior 7 to dilution, had contained as an additive, any mercury based 8 product, whether at preservative or trace amount levels.

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11 Sec. 10. Exemption.

The Director of Public Health may exempt the use of a vaccine from the requirements of this Act if the Director finds, and the Governor concurs, that an actual or potential bioterrorist incident or other actual or potential public health emergency, including an epidemic or a shortage of supply of a vaccine that would prevent children under 3 years of age and knowingly pregnant women from receiving the needed vaccine, makes necessary the administration of a vaccine containing more mercury than the maximum level set forth in this Act. The exemption shall meet all of the following requirements:

- (1) The exemption shall not be issued for more than 12 months.
- 24 <u>(2) At the end of the effective period of the</u> 25 <u>exemption</u>, the Director may issue another exemption for up

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1	to 12 months for the same incident or public health
2	emergency if the Director makes a determination that the
3	exemption is necessary as set forth in this Section, the
4	Governor concurs with the exemption, and the Director
5	notifies the General Assembly and interested parties,
6	pursuant to subsections (3), (4), and (5) of this Section.
7	(3) Upon issuing an exemption, the Director and the
8	Governor shall, within 48 hours, notify the General
9	Assembly about the exemption and about the Director's
10	findings justifying the exemption's approval.
11	(4) Upon request for an exemption, the Department shall
12	notify an interested party who has expressed his or her
13	interest to the Department in writing that an exemption
14	request has been made.
15	(5) Upon issuing an exemption, the Director shall,
16	within 7 days, notify interested parties who have expressed
17	their interest to the Director in writing about the
18	exemption and about the Director's findings justifying the
19	<pre>exemption's approval.</pre>
20	The Department of Public Health may exempt the use of a vaccine

19	interest to the Department in writing, that an exemption
20	request has been made.
21	(5) Upon issuing an exemption, the Department shall,
22	within 7 days, notify an interested party, who has
23	expressed his or her interest to the Department in writing,
24	about any exemption and about the Department's findings
25	justifying the exemption's approval.
