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1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the MRSA Screening and Reporting Act.
 - Section 5. MRSA control program. In order to improve the prevention of hospital-associated bloodstream infections due to methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus ("MRSA"), every hospital shall establish an MRSA control program that requires:
- 10 (1) Identification of all MRSA-colonized patients in
 11 all intensive care units, and other at-risk patients
 12 identified by the hospital, through active surveillance
 13 testing.
 - (2) Isolation of identified MRSA-colonized or MRSA-infected patients in an appropriate manner.
- 16 (3) Monitoring and strict enforcement of hand hygiene 17 requirements.
- 18 (4) Maintenance of records and reporting of cases under
 19 Section 10 of this Act.
- 20 Section 10. Reporting by Department of Public Health.
- 21 (a) After October 1, 2007, the Department of Public Health 22 shall compile aggregate data for all hospitals on the total

- 1 of infections due methicillin-resistant number to 2 Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) that (1) are present on admission 3 to a hospital and (2) occurred during the hospital stay, reported separately, as compiled from diagnostic codes 4 5 contained in the Hospital Discharge Dataset provided to the Department; provided, that this reporting requirement shall 6 apply only for patients in all intensive care units and other 7 8 at-risk patients identified by hospitals for 9 surveillance testing for MRSA. The Department is authorized to 10 require hospitals, based on quidelines developed by the 11 National Center for Health Statistics, after October 1, 2007, 12 to submit data to the Department that is coded as "present on 13 admission" and "occurred during the stay".
- 14 (b) The Department shall make such data available on its
 15 web site, in an annual report, and on the Hospital Report Card
 16 pursuant to the Hospital Report Card Act.
- 17 Section 90. Repeal. This Act is repealed on January 1, 2011.
- 19 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 20 becoming law.
