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1 AN ACT concerning health.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Diabetes Initiative Act.

6 Section 5. Diabetes initiative.

7 (a) The Department of Human Services shall develop a 8 strategic plan to slow the rate of diabetes as a result of 9 obesity and other environmental factors by the year 2010. The 10 Department shall collaborate with the Illinois State Diabetes 11 Commission and may convene work groups as necessary that may 12 include:

13 (1) health care professionals and researchers14 specializing in diabetes treatment or research;

(2) diabetes educators;

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16 (3) representatives of medical schools or schools of 17 public health;

(4) high school or college health educators;

19 (5) representatives from geographic areas or other
 20 population groups at higher risk of diabetes;

(6) representatives of community-based organizations
 involved in providing education, awareness, or support
 about diabetes; or

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1 (7) other representatives the Department determines 2 are necessary.

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(b) In developing the plan, the Department shall:

4 (1) identify barriers to effective screening
5 compliance and treatment for diabetes, including specific
6 barriers affecting providers and patients;

7 (2) identify methods to increase the number of
8 beneficiaries who will screen regularly for diabetes;

9 (3) review current medical therapies and best clinical 10 practices for diabetes, including the American Diabetes 11 Association clinical measures and recommendations, 12 including the importance of Body Mass Index as a key factor 13 to managing diabetes;

14 (4) review drugs and biologicals available to control 15 diabetes, including those that are provided upon failure of 16 oral medications and as ancillary to the provision of 17 insulin;

(5) review current screening, treatment, and related activities in this State and identify gaps in service delivery, use of technology, or use of current clinical measures and guidelines, such as those promulgated by the American Diabetes Association;

(6) identify actions to be taken to reduce the
morbidity and mortality from diabetes by the year 2010 and
a time line for taking those actions; and

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(7) make recommendations to the General Assembly on

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policy changes and funding needed to achieve the strategic plan.

3 (c) The Department shall deliver the plan to the Governor4 and to the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2008.

5 Section 10. Expiration. This Act is repealed on January 1,
6 2010.

Section 15. The Illinois State Diabetes Commission Act is
amended by changing Sections 5 and 10 as follows:

9 (20 ILCS 4055/5)

10 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2010)

Sec. 5. Illinois State Diabetes Commission. There is hereby 11 12 established within the Department of Human Services the 13 Illinois State Diabetes Commission. The Commission shall 14 consist of members that are residents of this State and shall include an Executive Committee appointed by the Secretary of 15 16 Human Services as provided by rule. The members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Secretary of Human 17 Services as follows: 18

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(1) The Secretary of Human Services or the Secretary's designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the Commission.

(2) Physicians who are board certified in
 endocrinology, with at least one physician with expertise
 and experience in the treatment of childhood diabetes and

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at least one physician with expertise and experience in the
 treatment of adult onset diabetes.

3 (3) Health care professionals with expertise and
4 experience in the prevention, treatment, and control of
5 diabetes.

6 (4) Representatives of organizations or groups that 7 advocate on behalf of persons suffering from diabetes.

8 (5) Representatives of voluntary health organizations 9 or advocacy groups with an interest in the prevention, 10 treatment, and control of diabetes.

11 (6) Members of the public who have been diagnosed with12 diabetes.

13 The Secretary of Human Services may appoint additional 14 members deemed necessary and appropriate by the Secretary. 15 (Source: P.A. 94-788, eff. 11-1-06.)

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18 Sec. 10. Members; meetings. Members of the Commission shall 19 be appointed <u>within one year after the effective date of this</u> 20 <u>amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly</u> by December 1, 21 2006. A member shall continue to serve until his or her 22 successor is duly appointed and qualified.

23 Meetings shall be held 3 times per year or at the call of 24 the Commission chairperson.
